Teen Theatre Sets 'On the Town'

For many people, the month of August means vacation time, but for 100 hard-working teens from the Port Washington-Manhasset area, it means final preparations for the Teen Summer Theater's annual musical production. This summer's presentation will be "On The Town", scheduled for one weekend, August 19, 20, 21, 22, at 8 PM in the Schreiber High School Auditorium. Best known for its song "New York, New York", and for its film adaptation with Frank Sinatra and Gene Kelly, "On The Town" boasts a score by Leonard Bernstein and book and lyrics by Betty Comden and Adolf Green.

Set during World War II, the story revolves around three sailors on leave for 24 hours in New York City. The three out-of-towners start by taking in the sights and wind up involved with three New York women - an anthropologist, a taxi driver and a beauty contest winner. On their way, they visit, and usually disrupt, such varied places as the Museum of Natural History, several nightclubs and a hooch dancer show at Coney Island.
