The Teen Summer Theater of Port Washington, featuring both Manhasset and Port Washington students, will present Betty Comden and Adolph Green's "On the Town" at 8 p.m. on Aug. 19, 20, 21, and 22 in the Schreiber High School auditorium on Campus / Drive in Port Washington.

Manhasset students in the cast include Lauren Doll, featured as "Miss Turnstiles," Linda Doll, Sheila Dowsey, Jeremy Mann, Jennifer Mayers, Lisa Mozer, and Roger Simmons.

Best known for its song, "New York, New York," and for its film adaptation with Frank Sinatra and Gene Kelly, "On The Town" boasts a score by Leonard Bernstein and book and lyrics by Comden and Green.

The story revolves around three sailors on leave for 24 hours in New York City.

Set during World War II, the show has the three out-of-towners start by taking in sights and wind up involved with three New York women, an anthropologist, a taxi driver, and a beauty contest winner.

On their way, they visit, and usually disrupt, such varied places as the Museum of Natural History, several nightclubs, and a

hootch dancer show at Coney Island.

Sponsored by the Port Washington Play Troupe and the Port Adult Education program, the Teen Summer Theater has been in existence for six years. It is financed by the contributions of local businesses and residents.
