Dear Padre July 15, 2018

Recently a genetic testing kit became available. Does the Church have any teaching on these tests?

In principle the Church is not opposed to genetic testing. The number of tests available seems to rise almost daily. The critical issue from a moral standpoint is what we do with the information that is gained.

Any use of the information to harm people would be judged immoral—for example, using genetic information to detect Down syndrome in a fetus with the subsequent abortion of a developing life. Another example would be using genetic information against people seeking employment or health insurance.

Another concern is the impact that genetic testing results might have on the person receiving it. For example, a person may wish to know if he carries the gene for Huntington's disease, an illness that will surface in his life if he has the gene. There is no cure for this debilitating disease. However, the information may assist him in preparing himself and others for the time when the disease will manifest itself.

In other instances, however, genetic information may lead to prevention and treatment of disease. Such testing would allow spouses to know if they carry a particular gene, for example, associated with cystic fibrosis. A couple finding themselves carriers of the gene should bear this in mind as they make decisions about responsible parenthood.

Summarizing, information obtained from genetic testing holds promise and potential peril. The dignity and life of persons should guide judgments about the morally acceptable use of genetic information.

New Candle Policy: Further clarification on candles... the candles that people were paying \$3 for actually cost \$2.47 each. That does not include the cost of the envelopes that are used to write intentions on, manpower to enter/proof the candle intention, ink to print or paper used. Bottom line... we were probably operating at a loss for each candle. Since Father is still giving us the option to have intentions published, if the higher \$5 is paid, we couldn't leave the candles by the named statues at the same price or everyone would be running to have the named candles. And as previously indicated, the Sanctuary Lamp candle is supposed to be a beeswax candle which is quite pricey as compared to the other candles. All that said, as of August 5th bulletin, candles that were previously \$3 can still be \$3, but those intentions will NOT be published, or for \$5, the intentions WILL be published. Candles that were \$5 by 5 of the named statues, specifically: Sacred Heart, St. Frances, Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Richard and St. Joseph, will be \$10. And the Sanctuary Lamp candle will increase from \$5 to \$20.

Reserved Seating: The first pew on the RIGHT, in front of the tabernacle, will be reserved for Liturgical Ministry, specifically for altar servers, Lector, and Eucharistic Ministers. The Lector and Eucharistic Ministers are encouraged to continue sitting with their families within in the church; however, if you need seating, there is seating reserved for you in the first pew. The first pew on the LEFT, in front of the pulpit, will be reserved for handicapped parishioners. A sign has been added to indicate that this pew is reserved for handicapped persons.
