

Technical Studies

The following studies should be practiced tongued as well as slurred. *Bang the valves down hard!* This v promote accuracy and rhythmic clarity. Do not be put off by difficult keys. Have the self-confidence and discipline to work on them. They will gradually become easier and easier. Tempos should range from very slow to as fast as possible. Use a metronome to promote evenness and to document progress.

1 **Major**
