If you have not heard, the “Oppose” the Transit bylaw fell short. 336 oppose votes were accepted and 28 rejected. To halt the bylaw, we needed just over 600. So according to the law the Transit Bylaw has been approved by the electorate.

Some may find this disheartening, but it shows how difficult it is to motivate people to go to a website find a form, copy it and return it. But there is some good news to be had. We are confident that had the Bylaw been for Tofino only, the necessary “Oppose” votes would have been achieved. The general interest in the subject gave a significant boost to the RPA membership. More people are now aware of taxation issues.

The RPA is considering writing to Municipal Affairs, to express our concerns over some of the details and procedures that we find objectionable.

Our main purpose is now to direct our attention to the Tofino Open House regarding the budget. And our priorities moving forward.
