## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Life's most urgent question is "What are you doing for others?" – Martin Luther King Jr.

Welcome to Spring in Florida. As reported by the website [floridatrippers.com](http://floridatrippers.com). Florida Weather in April is warm and dry...absolutely perfect. In April, we'll have warm days followed by cooler nights. It's not as oppressively hot as it can be in the summer, the nights are cooler and you will find less fog and wind as there can be in the proceeding months with more sunshine and breeze making it perfect "Hernando" beach weather.

April is also the last month in the dry season and rainfall is low. If it does rain it's normally very brief. The average rainfall is 2.3 inches and never exceeds 5.5 inches. The rain also tends to be more isolated to the areas on the Gulf Coast. Average temperatures in Florida in April are between 55° – 85° F. The overall average temperature is 71° F. Humidity tends to be around 69 - 72 %.

Is it just the weather or a combination of economic liberty, opportunity AND the weather that drives why Florida is experiencing a steady influx of new residents? On average, approximately 900 people relocate to Florida every day. To put this into perspective, it's like adding a city the size of Orlando to the state's population each year. Since 2015, more than 300,000 people have made the move to Florida annually, and state economists predict that this trend will continue into 2024.

I had the privilege to watch our county government in action on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March. On the agenda were variance requests, a couple of rezoning requests and Master Plan reviews. To boil them down – they were all reacting to the opportunities to accommodate an increasing population – whether it was the money they were going to spend by putting in a small strip mall or the housing they needed by building planned communities. The sheer number of actions for review pushed this meeting to the longest ever BOCC. One of the issues to address the county's growing populations demands for recreation was the approval of the Hernando County Weeki Wachee Preserve Park agreement with

the Southwest Florida Water Management District. This park is focused on the passive recreation available in the former mining pits that people in Hernando County have enjoyed for years, kayaking, hiking, walking, running, biking and bird watching. Now the county will have the onus to maintain it with trash pickup, maintenance of trails, the boardwalk, pavilions and picnic tables. You ask when will this be implemented? Like all things with the government, it'll take at least 8 months to lay out the plan to commit funds and start execution of the plan.

Our HBPOA Treasurer Jen Brown introduced our guest speaker Bill Gladson, State Attorney for the Fifth Judicial Circuit. Bill provided a succinct overview of his office and responsibilities as well as insight into "how are we doing keeping criminals off the streets?" Comparatively speaking, the 5<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit is #2 in prosecutions, higher than Miami! Bottom line, crime is down in Hernando County. Bill added that Hernando County and beyond have a human trafficking issue. Learn to look for the signs and report it. Please be sure to reply to the request from your Hospitality Team about our April Luau. We'll have a great time with our guest speaker, the Honorable Gus Bilirakis. Like the rest of Florida, we are growing too! Stacy Finsterbusch announced we have 166 properties in our membership and 4 joined us at the meeting! Mike Fulford reported on the upcoming candidate forum in May. These candidates will be responsible for addressing issues that impact residents of Hernando Beach. More to come on this in April.

Next to last item we discussed in new business was the announcement of public hearing for a planned convenience store with gas at the corner of Shoal Line Blvd and Osowaw. The developer presented to the P&Z on the 11<sup>th</sup> of March and the report is as follows just so you know its' not easy and the County is doing its best to listen to the concerns of the communities:

"It is recommended that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommend the Board of County Commissioners adopt a Resolution approving the petitioner's request to Establish a Master Plan on property zoned PDP(NC)/Planned Development Project (Neighborhood Commercial), but deny the request to include a specific C-1 use for Convenience Goods with Fuel Pumps with the following performance conditions."

There are 17 performance conditions that must be met before final approval for the project to move forward. You can find them on the county website in the staff recommendations:

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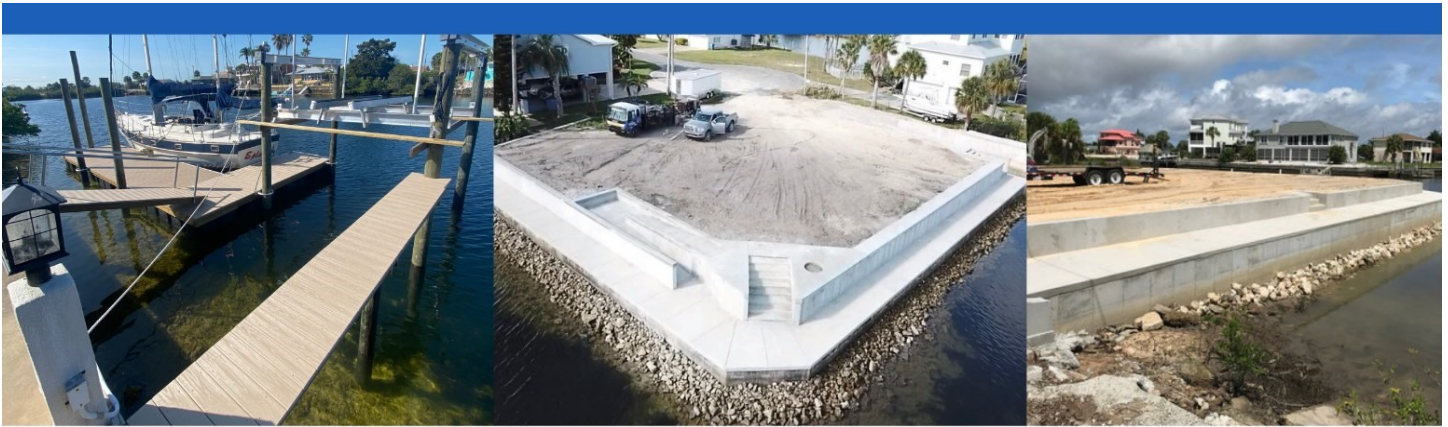

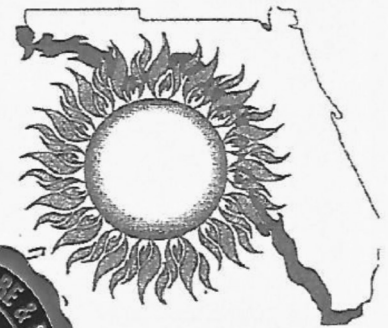

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### HERNANDO COUNTY PLANNING & ZONING

The Hernando County Planning & Zoning (P&Z) Commission acts as an advisory body to the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) on matters pertaining to rezoning and other land use issues in Hernando County, Florida. All functions are performed in a Quasi-Judicial forum. Quasi Judicial is defined as having the delegated authority to interpret EXISTING Ordinances, Regulations and Policies as they have been adopted by the BOCC.

The BOCC is the only body that can create, change and adopt those Ordinances, Regulations and Policies. The P&Z Commission consists of seven members. Five members are appointed at the discretion of each County Commissioner, and two alternate members are appointed by the Board of County Commissioners as a whole. They meet in Brooksville usually the second Monday of each month in the BOCC Chambers. All meetings are publicly noticed and video recorded. All participants are sworn and testimony is subject to perjury. All counties in the State of Florida are required to have a P&Z as directed by the Legislature.

The P&Z has delegated decision authority for Conditional Use Permits and Special Exceptions. Conditional Use Permits are usually two years for temporary structures and five years for excavations. They are usually granted in rural areas for hardships. Specially Exceptions are granted with the property and not the owner. The P&Z can issue both. They are effective 30 days after issuing. The BOCC can review the P&Z decision. If not approved by the BOCC, the applicant can file a civil objection in the Circuit Court. Decision making is evidence based. Statements must be included in the application packet in order to be considered. Additionally, only in-person testimony is considered. All deliberations are subject to the Florida "Sunshine Law Legislation". As it relates to Public Inquiry Workshops (PIW), the require-

ments are determined by the nature of the application. Not every application warrants a PIW. They usually add 30 days to 60 processing time. The County P&Z Staff, P&Z Commission and other agencies can request a PIW based upon the intensity of the impact. The purpose of the PIW is to identify up-front issues prior to the P&Z Commission hearings.

The P&Z adjudicates applications based upon substantial, materiel and competent evidence. Both the applicant and those citizens in opposition to an application can appeal the decision to the BOCC.

If not satisfied with the BOCC decision, parties can file in Circuit Court. Variance applications are administrative in nature and are not heard by the P&Z. They are decided by the county zoning official. Adjudication considers principally if the application is in conflict with the counties comprehensive plan, causes significant impact to the community or violates an existing ordinance or law. An Assistant County Attorney advises the P&Z on legal matters.

To a resident attempting to understand the difference between a Code Enforcement action and a rezoning request can be a challenge. For example, a rezoning request was granted for a property located in Hernando Beach recently. Knowingly or unknowing, the applicant during the application process proceeded to utilize the property in a manner that they were making application

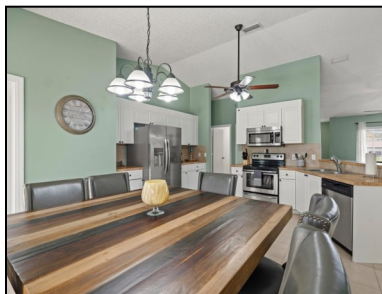

for. This then became a zoning violation, which must be remedied by a code enforcement action. Separate from a rezoning action. For general knowledge, with the exception of three properties on Shoal Line that are currently zoned as residential, all other properties are zoned commercial or commercial marine.

We are a nation of laws and due process. P&Z actions are usually complex in nature, and subject to the quasi judicial process. Substantial, competent, and materiel evidence has to be provided in order to approve or deny an application. It is important for a community to appear in person in order to provide sworn testimony to either support or show opposition to an application. Communities such as Timber Pines, Glen Lakes and other organized groups have been successful in having their voice heard in mass.

## **GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE**

Government Affairs Committee Update for March 2024. Between now and November, it will be an exciting time for Hernando County Voters. The August Primary is the time we elect our Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) unless there is a closed primary. Let me explain. Florida is a closed primary state meaning that voters are only allowed to vote for the party that they are registered in for the August Primary. There are exceptions. If all the candidates for an office are of the same political party then all Voters

are allowed to vote for that office regardless of party. Two situations close a primary. First, there are candidates for that office registered in an opposing party, then the successful candidate of that party goes to the general election in November. The other situation is when a "write in" candidate files. They do not appear in the primary, but are listed as a "write in" candidate in the general election. Confused yet? This actually occurred in the 2020 election cycle for our voting District where political leadership recruited a "write in" candidate in order to close the primary. It's a strategy rarely employed only when political leadership feels their chosen candidate is at risk. Look out for a "write in" candidate when they appear on the ballot. It's telling. Non Political Affiliated (NPA) Offices are primarily what is referred to as the Constitutional Offices (Clerk of Courts, Tax Collector, Property Assessor, etc.) and School Board are determined in the General Election or for this year, the Presidential Election. Candidates must live in the District that they are running in, but are elected by the entire county. The Hernando Beach Property Owners Association (HBPOA) will host a candidates forum to inform our membership and community to be an informed voter in August and November. Candidates registered to date are Anthony Arenz (BOCC, District 1), Marvin Baynham, Burton Melaugh, and Luciano Vignali (BOCC District 3), Kevin Johnston and Randy Mazourek (Property Appraiser), and Frankie Davis (Tax Collector). I am sure the list will grow as we get closer to 2 May. We are going to try to keep to about 12 candidates for about a 2.5 hour forum. Each candidate will have the opportunity to speak un-interrupted for 5 minutes, and round two will be a short question and an-

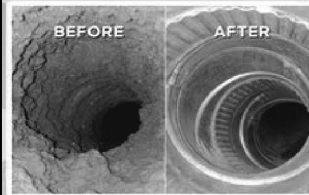
