





Habitat

Inshore in coastal waters, including mangrove shorelines, seagrass beds, beaches and around structure.

Behavior

Begin life as males, but between 18 and 22 inches long some become females. Form schools during spawning season.

Feed on fish and large crustaceans.

Cannot tolerate water temperatures below 60° F. Can tolerate freshwater.

Additional Information

<u>State Record:</u> 45 lbs 12 oz, caught near Sebastian

Fishing Tips and Facts: They orient themselves to face moving water and wait for prey to be carried down the current. Snook jump clear of the water, and burst into long runs. Use live pinfish, small mullet, shrimp, or sardines free-lined or fished off the bottom with a fish finder rig. They take a large variety of lures based on water con-

ditions. Beware of the snook's razor-sharp gill covers! Snook make excellent table fare.
