To: The Appropriations Committees and the leadership and full membership of the VT House and Senate, the Administration of Governor Phil Scott, and all the citizens of Vermont!

We will have a crisis of astounding proportions this summer! If that sounds alarmist, it only hints at how alarming it will be for Vermonters experiencing homelessness and the cities, towns and villages of Vermont that will need to respond to people without shelter in their communities. Despite all the talk about housing being everyone's number one priority, the only plan offered for this summer, fall, and next winter, is a massive UNHOUSING of those currently in motel-based shelter.

The State of Vermont has been spending \$6-7 Million a month to provide motel-housing for 1,800 households (2,800 individuals) as of January 2023. The Vermont Legislature and the Scott administration are on track to allocate <u>less than half that amount</u> in their current budget for FY24 (from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024).

Nobody feels that motel-housing has been ideal, but turning half of the people in motel-housing out into the street is unacceptable! And it won't save money! Close to 1,000 of our neighbors will experience the very real trauma, lack of safety, and deprivation that comes from living without any shelter. There is literally nowhere for them to go. All of our communities will absorb the increased costs of public safety, emergency medical systems, public health and sanitation, and physical and mental health resources, and at a time that staffing of those services is already severely strained.

Given this looming crisis, this is what we need immediately – an FY24 State Budget that:

- Addresses the scale of our current reality: \$72 M to DCF for motel-based or alternative shelter will cover the next 12 months.
- **Funds the creation of alternatives** to motel-based shelter: \$40 M to VHCB will expand shelter capacity throughout the state by 120 beds.
- Provides safe and supportive shelter that enables people to attain permanent housing:
 \$20 M to supplement HOP grants will add support services and housing navigation services to those in the state's shelter system.
- **Expands evidence-based human service support models** (such as Pathways VT, SASH, and Family Supportive Housing) that have proven effective in assisting people to obtain and retain permanent housing: \$6.9 M will expand these services to the scale of need statewide.

For over 30 years, the State of Vermont has consistently made decisions that limited the development and funding of affordable housing. Furthermore, we failed to set the minimum wage at a level that would cover basic needs, such as rising rents.

Because of these decisions, it was entirely predictable that we would have a housing crisis and that those most affected would be those with the least resources to respond. We are all culpable, and we are all morally responsible for providing safe and secure shelter and support until permanent housing becomes available. This is the responsibility of the State of Vermont, and we expect you as our leaders to make it happen.
