

Please Park Your Vehicle Correctly

- *Keep our Neighborhood Safe*
- *Keep our Neighborhood Looking Nice*
- *Stay within the Law*

Georgia State Law

- 1) Vehicles must be parked parallel to the curb, facing the direction of traffic* and within 12 inches of the curb (§40-6-200)
- 2) A vehicle standing upon any grade must turn the front wheels to the curb and set the brake (§40-6-201)
- 3) No vehicle can stand or park, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger: (§40-6-203)
 - (A) In front of a public or private driveway;
 - (B) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
 - (C) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
 - (D) Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic-control signal

Gwinnett County Ordinance

- 1) Vehicles must not obstruct traffic and must leave at least 10 feet of roadway for free movement of traffic. (GCCO 110-63)
- 2) No commercial vehicles (trucks, trailers, machinery) may be parked anywhere in residential subdivision. (ZR1007)
- 3) Parking trailers or RV's on the street for more than one hour is illegal. (GCCO 110-79C).
- 4) Parking vehicles on the lawn is illegal. (ZR1001.6)
- 5) Having inoperative or unregistered vehicles outside is illegal. (Property Main Sect 14-303)

The Springmont Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions (additional restrictions also apply)

- 1) No resident or member of a resident's household may routinely park any kind of vehicle on any street or portion of any street. Non-residents may park in front of a resident while physically visiting, but no longer than 48 hours. Article Two, Section 3.1
- 2) Trailers, boats on trailers, campers, and recreational vehicles should not be routinely parked in any place where they are visible from any street longer than 10 days. Article Two, Section 3.m.

* Park in the direction of traffic with passenger door near curb: (a) reflectors on back help others to see the vehicle, (b) avoids crossing road and driving into oncoming traffic, (c) looks nicer, and (d) it's the law.

How to Park Correctly

- 1) Park in the Driveway or Garage

 - d. Move the car into the driveway at night
