Underground Evangelism was a nondenominational Christian mission working in the communist countries of Eastern Europe, the Soviet Union and China.

Began work as the writer/producer of the film *Enemies of the State*, used by the mission to generate donor support; then hired as director of the EastWest Information Center, located in Munich. Produced a bi-monthly information packet sent out to Underground Evangelism's 13 affiliate offices worldwide, which included stories or reports based on my personal experiences traveling in the East, the experiences of our field workers, and other sources. Also included in the packets were captioned photo materials. The information in the packets was used by the affiliate offices in their magazines and for fund-raising purposes. Wrote promotional material at the request of the home office in Camarillo, California, and carried out promotional speaking tours in Germany, Sweden, and England. Produced a slide show for use by the affiliate offices.

In 1987 returned to Underground Evangelism's home office. In addition to ongoing production of the bi-monthly information packet, began writing direct mail appeals, writing and producing the Underground Evangelism magazine, and writing various other support and promotional materials. In late 1988, the mission purchased a desktop publishing system, which I began using in the layout of the magazine and in some appeal and other material. Wrote and produced another slide show and shot video on trips to China and the Soviet Union and continued doing promotional speaking in churches, serving also as a mission spokesman on various radio programs.
