## Suggestions for sharing the courts if others are waiting to play pickleball

We have 2 courts of pickleball, allowing up to 8 players at a time.
If others are waiting, you have the right to stay on your pickleball court until the top of the hour, when you need to get off so others can get on.

## BUT there's feed-in play...

You may have more fun by including the waiting players, \& you get to play with \& against several players. For example:

1. When the game ends, the winning pair stays on the court but splits up, \& the 2 new players each pair up with a winner.
2. The sequence continues when that game finishes: the 2 winners split up \& 2 new players join.

## AND...

You may find that the available players fall into 2 groups: power players \& finesse players, \& you may want to make 1 court for each type.

1. Power players - experienced, really fast paced, lots of slams \& action
2. Finesse players - prefer 'dinking' \& slicing the ball, less slamming, or newer to game

## FINALLY...

Don't be shy - you can ask the players on the other pickleball court if they'd like to mix it up \& play between both courts.

One of the reasons pickleball is so popular is that it's a very social sport you're physically close to your partner \& opponents, \& you're chatting with others as you wait your turn!
