



P.R.N. – Parliamentary Rules Noted The Parliamentarians of Psi



How Are Motions Processed? (Bringing Business before the Assembly)

The primary purpose of meetings that use rules of order is for the group to make decisions. To begin the process of making any decision, a member offers a proposal by making a motion. A **motion** is a formal proposal by a member in a meeting, that the group take certain action. [RONR (12th ed.) 3:22]

There are eight steps in handling a motion.

	Action	Responsibility		Action	Responsibility
1.	Obtaining the floor	Member A	5.	Stating the motion	Chair
-2.	Assigning the floor	Chair	6.	Debate	Members*
3.	Making the motion	Member A	7.	Putting the question	Chair
4.	Seconding the motion	Member B	8.	Announcing the vote	Chair

*Member A has the first right to debate

Example Script

Member A (OBTAINING the FLOOR): Madam Chair!

Chair (ASSIGNING the FLOOR): Member A

Member A (MAKING THE MOTION): I move that Psi purchase a \$100 Ad for the AAM Gala.

Member B (SECONDING THE MOTION): Second!

Chair (STATING THE MOTION): It has been moved and seconded that Psi purchase a \$100 Ad for the AAM Gala.

Chair: Is there any discussion?

Then the Chair immediately turns toward Member A to see if she wishes the floor first in debate. **Member A**: (Is already rising to claim the floor.) **Chair:** (RECOGNIZES Member A): Member A

Member A (DEBATE/DISCUSSION): We should purchase the \$100 Ad since the AAM hosted our exhibit. (Others may also speak in debate) Chair (When debate ends): Is there any further debate or discussion?

Chair (PUTTING THE QUESTION): Are you ready for the question? The question is on the motion that Psi purchase a \$100 Ad for the AAM Gala. (*Pause*) All those in favor, say "Aye". All those opposed, say "No".

Chair (ANNOUNCING THE VOTE): The Ayes have it and the motion is carried. The Ad will be purchased. The next item of business is ______.


