

Crabapple - Sargentii "Tina"



LEAF COLOR: rich green summer color fading to yellow fall.

HABIT: Dwarf Sargent type with low spreading branches. It is disease resistant and is a highly ornamental small tree for limited spaces. Plant as a specimen or in groups. Grafted on 42" stem.

CULTURE: Exposure full sun, medium mositure. Pruning off suckers is a good idea any time of year. Pruning if needed should be done in early June.

GROWTH RATE: Medium

FLOWER: Red buds open to single white flowers 3/4" diameter.

Blooms late spring (May) Very attractive. FRUIT: Bright red, 5/16" diameter.
