## REMEBERING ELLEN

Ellen Eggleston Jogo

11/3/1920 - 2/4/2023




Proud daughter of Deposit whose tireless efforts, knowledge of the community, creative ideas, strong convictions, and can-do attitude challenged us to do more and to do better.

She was the only child of John Elmer Eggleston and Maria (Schwenz) Eggleston. After graduating from Deposit High School, she attended Fredonia College for voice and piano and went on to attend the Leland Powers School of Radio & Television in Boston. In June of 1942, she became an announcer – perhaps the first woman to hold this job – at WSLB in Ogdensburg, NY. She and her husband, a musician she met at the radio station, returned to Deposit to raise their family. They had two sons, Nick & Peter.


Ellen's contributions to the community are legendary, In addition to spending many years working for Valley Offset (a job she loved), some of the organizations that benefitted from Ellen's dedication, in addition to the Historical Society, include the First Baptist Church, Order of the Eastern Star, the Study Club, and local theater companies. The Rotary Club made her an honored member for her devotion to the community.


She left the Historical Society a legacy of detailed research papers, publications, entertaining programs, and beautiful exhibits. Here are some of our favorites.



Before postcard books were ubiquitous, Ellen put together one of our earliest and most popular publications featuring photos of postcards from the Museum collection.

Another of Ellen's brainchildren, *Strolling Through Time*, is a walking guide of Deposit featuring vintage photos of buildings in the village. Deposit boasts one of the most extensive collections of pre-civil war homes. A centerfold map is included.





Passing the Time with "Vic" is the most exhaustive history of Deposit based on Vic Ruegger's Courier articles. It was conceived and edited by Ellen with 200+ vintage photos. If you have a question about Deposit this is your first go to resource.

This is Ellen in one of her favorite historical costumes – always a flare for the theatrical to make the event more memorable.



As a seamstress and lover of fashion she was the curator of our clothing collection and produced 3 memorable fashion shows – always to a full house.

# The Deposit Historical Society in cooperation with the Deposit State Theatre proudly presents 2 films about Cannonsville on July 1st at 2 PM

The Fall of Cannonsville and Indian Summer (restored version), two films that tell the story of how the Cannonsville Reservoir was built and the devastating effect it had on the residents of the valley, will be shown at the Deposit State Theatre on July 1st at 2 PM, free of charge. Both films were originally screened at the Museum of Modern Art in NYC in January. The showing on July 1st will be the first time that the films will be seen by the folks at the center of the story. Charles Cadkin, responsible for the restoration of Indian Summer and the director of The Fall of Cannonsville, will attend and will participate in a Q & A after the screening. He wanted to share the films with the community free of charge. That has been made possible through the sponsorship of the Deposit Historical Society and the cooperation of the Deposit State Theatre.
