STEPHEN RILEY (Tenor Saxophonist)

Born in Greenville, North Carolina, in 1975, Stephen Riley began playing the violin (Suzuki method) at the age of 4. His mother was a classical voice and piano teacher and valued music education for both Stephen and his brother who is a professional drummer. At age 10, Stephen began playing the alto saxophone and became very interested in jazz by listening and absorbing the sounds of Miles Davis, John Coltrane, Charlie Parker, Sonny Rollins, Lester Young, among others.

Stephen was accepted into a high school of the arts in Florida and made the transition to tenor saxophone. At age 17, he won the Stan Getz / Clifford Brown Fellowship Award. Bassist Rufus Reid, one of the judges for this competition, recognized Stephen's unique talent and invited him to attend William Patterson University, in Wayne, New Jersey, where Rufus was head of the Jazz Department. After a year at William Patterson, he moved to New York City, where he was quickly noticed by many highly-esteemed jazz artists.

Stephen began touring and recording with such artists as Wynton Marsalis and the "Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra", The Harper Brothers (European Reunion Tour), The Mingus Big Band (shows at The Time Cafe NYC), Ray Charles (Southeastern U.S. tour), Harry Connick Jr. ("Songs I Heard" U.S. tour), Wynton Marsalis small group (featuring Stefon Harris, Reuben Rogers, Ali Jackson, Stephen Riley, Wessell Anderson, Ron Westray, and Eric Lewis), and Marcus Roberts (Blues for The New Millennium tour.)

Stephen Riley has been and is currently a featured artist at Jazz at Lincoln Center's concert series. In Scandinavia, Stephen regularly tours with Snorre Kirk.
