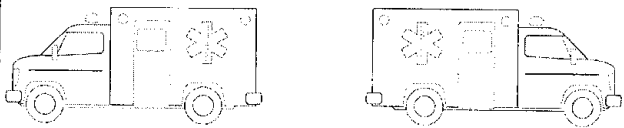

Are you ready to come over to the dark side yet my fellow North Dakotans? With the NFL draft starting up this week, I was pleased to hear, earlier this month, that some quarterback from NORTH DAKOTA had been signed by the KC Chiefs! You know that kid from Bismarck... the #2 draft pick in 2016...the sophomore player that took the Philadelphia Eagles to the playoffs in 2017, got seriously injured and had to watch his own backup, Nick Foles, win the Superbowl that year. To say I was glad to see the Chiefs pick up Carson Wentz, even if it is only on a 1-year deal, would be an understatement. The guy has had a rough go of it starting with his torn ACL (2017), a broken vertebra (2018) and, trade to the Indianapolis Colts, Washington Commanders (fka Redskins), and LA Rams (2021-2023). It's a common tale in the NFL where college success, a huge arm and a big body don't always ensure a lengthy career with one single team.

In 2016, the NCAA reported that 1,083,308 high school kids played football. 73,660 (6.8%) of them made it to college but, only 2.6% of them to Division 1 schools. Among those, only 16,369 (22%) ever became NFL draft-eligible to fill only 253 slots (roughly 1.5% of the original number). Long story short? Out of those 1,083,308 high school football players, only 251 made it to the pros for a miniscule 0.023%. And, that, folks, is why Carson Wentz doesn't take a back seat to anyone. He made it to the pros as one of those guys, survived two serious injuries, got a Superbowl ring and stuck it out for his 8th year. I'm proud that he's now on my favorite team backing up the best quarterback I've ever seen.

And, as Mr. Mahomes has shown over the last 5 season, he is most dangerous when he gets a little banged-up. I personally think that Carson Wentz is a great catch and, his choice to backstop Mahomes is the smartest thing that has happened to the Chiefs this year what with the bad news from Dallas, Texas, about Mahomes' best receiver last year (Rashee Rice) who isn't going to be playing for quite some time in 2024. Carson Wentz is a solid quarterback with a good, veteran head on his shoulders and if, God forbid, Mahomes goes down, it's comforting to know that Wentz can pilot the boat. I'm looking forward to another great year of Chiefs football and, it's a two-fer that one of my favorite college players is now on the team. Have a great week and, remember...it's only 4 short months before the NFL pre-season!

Hettinger Public Golf Course Offering "Learn A Little About Golf Night" on May 8th!

Everyone can play golf, right? Well, golf is a four-letter word, no doubt about it. And it can be frustrating to hit it straight and the right distance. And we're all trying to get a 1.68 inch diameter golf ball into a 4.25 inch diameter hole about 150 to 500 yards away from where we started! They do let us set our ball on a tee for our first shot on each hole -- but that's about the only advantage we get. Let the club do the work! Right! But, wouldn't it be great to learn the basic fundamentals (grip, stance, swing)? And maybe play a sport that is always outdoors in the fresh air and one of the few sports you can play for the rest of your life?

After all, most sports like basketball, football, baseball, volleyball, wrestling and track, are absolutely over for most of us, after our high school years. A few, very few, might continue to play one of these sports in college. Even fewer yet play in the professional ranks. Therefore, golf is the answer for most all of us -- as a sport at least, post high school.

And, there are 38,864 golf courses all over the world! Approximately 15,000 in the USA alone! Closer to home, there are 141 golf courses in North Dakota, 154 in South Dakota! So, most everywhere you could possibly live, has a golf course -- or at least one nearby. Well, maybe not in Antarctica! But, you know what we mean.

Our current golf course track has been here since 1961, when Joe and Hazel Manning turned a few of their strips of farmland

and shelterbelts into a nine hole "sand green" golf course. Prior to that, the local 9 was up behind the Western Horizons Care Center by Shelf Rock. Thanks to a sensational group of people (led by Dennis Freed) who got together back at the turn of the century (1998-2000), we now have a beautiful public, nine-hole, "grass green," golf course, just south of Hettinger. And we need to keep improving it!

Back to the article -- To draw more people out to the Hettinger Public Golf Course, south and a little east of town about 4 miles (just go to the end of Hettinger's Main street, head east past The Gutter bowling alley, keep going on the pavement past Even-son's Ranch, over the railroad tracks, around the curve by Larson's, and south on the pavement another couple miles to the top of the hill), we are hosting one of our first-ever "Learn A Little About Golf Night" on Wednesday, May 8th, anytime between 5-7pm.

We need everyone from the area who does not know anything about "playing golf" to come see us. Maybe only for 30 minutes or an hour or so. Or maybe you know a little and would like to learn a little more about the correct fundamentals. If you have golf clubs, bring them. If not, don't worry about it. We'll have clubs, tees, balls, etc., to get you started. We'll also have 6-8 local volunteer instructors available at the driving range to give you a little direction with your grip, stance and swing. And you'll even get to take a whack at a few range balls! So, if nothing else, come see us to take a little stress out of your life!

If you want, bring your kids. If not, that's ok too. Just in case, we have clubs, tees and balls for our area youth too. And we can help teach them the basic fundamentals as well.

Why wouldn't ya? It's a fun

outing. It's free. You can bring your kids. Or not. This game and leisure activity just might be the thing you need to enjoy this summer. Maybe you'll join a women's or men's league or maybe a mixed league? Or play in a fun scramble golf tournament? Or maybe your kids will join our Youth Golf Camp, Youth Golf Friday Mornings and play in our Youth Golf Tournament?

Plus, we are thinking we should provide you with a beverage on this night -- just for coming out to see us and learning a few fundamentals of golf. Or maybe you just want to scout our place out for a possible class reunion, bachelorette party, your wedding or a family gathering. No matter -- the first beverage of your choice is on us, atleast for this night.

HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life
by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue today with our consideration of the first verse of 1 Peter 1: "Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To the pilgrims of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia." Last time we looked at the human author. We noted that Christ in His infinite grace gave the disciple who had failed miserably by denying Him three times the highest rank ever given to anyone in the church—that of apostle. Now we proceed to consider those to whom this book was initially addressed. The first thing we notice about recipients of this letter is the manner in which Peter describes them. He calls them "pilgrims." The word "pilgrim" means one who is a temporary resident. Peter in the very first words he says to his Christian readers is reminding them that this earth is not their permanent home. Here the apostle is immediately putting everything into the right perspective. The lives of those to whom he is writing are hard. But all of that which makes their lives hard is only temporary. They are just temporarily residing on this earth. Another way the word "pilgrim" is translated is "alien." The brethren whom Peter addresses are aliens here. They belong to another place. Their home and their citizenship are in heaven. What Peter is saying to us is that as believers, our journey through this life should be traveled with our eyes upon heaven, our true homeland.

But note further that Peter refers to his readers as "pilgrims of the Dispersion." Among the Jews, "dispersion" was a technical term which referred to the people of Israel being scattered into the various parts of the world. Peter was writing to Christians who were living in a variety of locations: Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia. What is interesting about this expression is that Peter is applying the term "dispersion" to Gentiles, as well as to Jews who were a part of Christ's church. The apostle seems deliberately to be applying to Gentile Christians expressions which once were applied exclusively to Jews of the nation Israel as the people of God. The New Testament writers of Scripture see the church as the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies to Israel. Since the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, it is not national Israel or physical Jews, but believers, both Jew and Gentile, who make up the church and who are now the special people of God.

Next time, Lord willing, we shall see more of Peter's description of Christians, but I wish to close by asking you to consider whether you are among the people of God. Have you placed your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God? If not, you are among those whom the apostle Paul describes as being in a most dreadful condition: "without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world" (Ephesians 2:12). This is the condition into which all of us were born. Unless we are brought to see our sinful, hopeless state and our desperate need of what Christ did on the cross to accomplish the salvation of His people and place our faith exclusively in Him to restore us to God, we will go into a hopeless eternity. Please be sure that you are one of the pilgrims traveling through this world to an eternal home with Jesus.

They will compete against 3000 other students during the weeklong event from June 9-13.

The Enchanted Highway has certainly been a "Turning Point in History" for the City of Regent, SW North Dakota and the entire State of North Dakota. Good Luck to Marlee and Reece as they represent the Great State of North Dakota and our proud history.

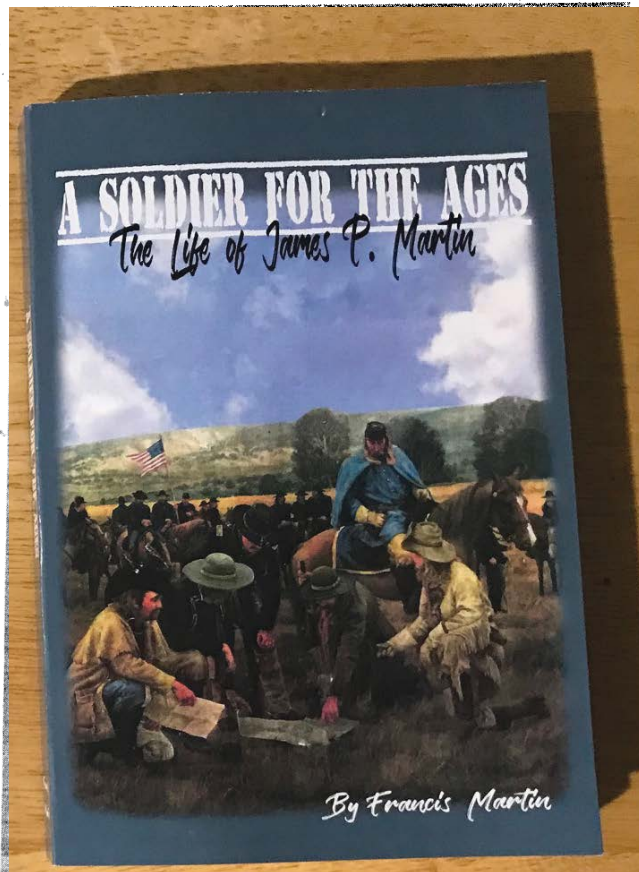

By now, he was a seasoned soldier and with the escalation of the war, men like James were badly needed. While he was mulling over this, he fell into a major depression. He would wake up in the night panting for air and wet with sweat. He dreamed of men without their limbs screaming for help. He dreamed that he went among the wounded and shot them so they would quit screaming. He woke others up when he yelled out in his sleep to retreat. He was told that he talked about Gen. Custer in his sleep. Some laughed, but not all of them. Some had been under his command on the knoll. They knew why he had gone mad.

clared James unfit to continue. He had one of the worst cases of PTSD the doctor had ever encountered. Even though the head doctor assured James that once he got back to the farm, it would go away, the doctor knew it would never go away.

"Think about the farm," the head doctor told him, "They surely need you there." He thought about the request for him to re-up. He was needed here, but he was needed at home. Then the doctor asked him if he saw many Meadow Larks in North Dakota. Meadow Larks. The sound of Spring in the meadow. It was a calming picture in his messed-up head. He needed to go home to his wife and new son.

One the 25th of March 1966, he was airlifted out of Vietnam, never to return. The plane landed two days later at the San Francisco Airport. As he walked through the terminal with his uniform on to catch his flight to Minneapolis, he was constantly heckled with snide remarks for his service to his country. He hadn't any choice. When you don't have any choice, do what you can with what you have. He had put his life on the line for his country only to be treated like a criminal. He made his connection to Minneapolis and then to Bismarck. Along the way he rarely spoke to anyone. Two days earlier he had been living in a sandbag bunker. Now he was almost home. He couldn't wait to see Kadee and his new son.

In his pocket were the dog tags he had picked up on the battlefield. He had forgotten to give them to the medics.

He had two weeks' leave from the 7th Airborne Cavalry and he wasn't going to waste a minute of it. He had to get re-acquainted with his family. He needed to get his hands busy with farm work again. It felt

great.

He needed to find out where Dan'l was. Kadee had told him twice over that Dan'l was at Ft. Mead in Sturgis, S.D. The next day he would ask her the same question and she would give him the same answer. Finally, it dawned on him. Then he said, "We should go to Ft. Mead and see him."

She agreed and was about to make plans to do just that, but he got on the tractor and went out to the field.

Kadee didn't tell him about his nightmares. She sat up with his head on her lap while he cried and swore and sweated. Grandma Caroline would come quickly and rush away with the baby.

The local people were delighted to see him back, and alive. This was not the west coast. There were a lot of young men who were now being sent to Vietnam from the surrounding area. Some of the neighbors asked him about what was going on over there, but he couldn't talk about it without going into a depression.

The two weeks went by way too fast. James' dad had bought another section of land and began to make plans for a bigger herd of cattle and the work of providing more feed and vaccinations, and veterinarian care.

James felt that he had really made progress on the depression. He didn't remember what went on with him at night. He went back to FT. Benning, Ga. to finish his tour of duty. During that time his job was to train recruits that would be sent to Southeast Asia. After what he had seen on the battlefields of Vietnam, he was careful not to get close to any of the men he trained. He knew, too well, what was ahead for them. The dog tags were a sad reminder.

Also, during that time, James had become part of a group of Civil War reenactors. This was his new passion. He actually found out more about Gen. Custer there than he had in Montana. He would still be part of the old 7th Cavalry. He bought a Union uniform and a hat and boots. Saddles were in short supply from that era, but when one of the men left, James was able to buy his saddle. He was never able to find a sword, which was a disappointment. He couldn't imagine Custer without a sword on his hip. What he imagined was Custer on his gray/roan horse outfitted for war with the sword in the scabbard.

"Did he take his medicine this morning?"

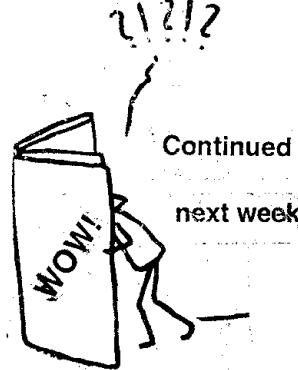
"I don't ask. It just upsets him."

Gabriel "Gabe" G. Maliske, 61, of Fargo, ND, passed away at the Sanford Medical Center in Fargo.



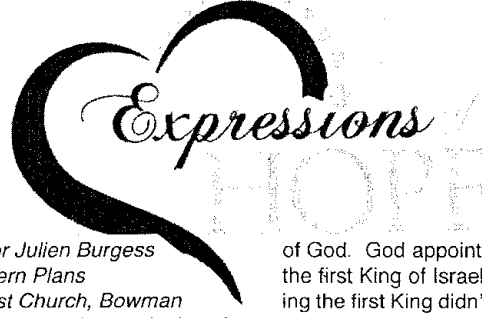

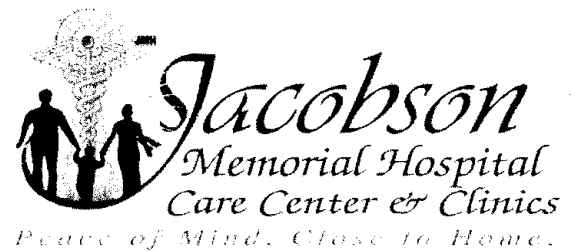

"The First Steel Ag Plow"

area for crop planting became the day's question at hand. Put another way, the soil would stick to the plow's surface and would need to be scraped off by the farmer with a wooden paddle, which would require regular stops from the farmer, the harnessed horse, or the pulling mule, which certainly hampered a day's planting efforts.

The idea for "The First Steel Ag Plow" was plagued with two main issues. Early in the 1830s, when America was still a young nation, no plate steel was produced in this country yet. Thus, there was also a lack of easily accessible tempered plate steel that could be ordered. Consequently, the challenge of shaping steel plate into a curved shape, which was required for a functional plow moldboard, arose.

Note: Sheffield, England, dominated the world steel market in the first part of the 1800s, supplying tool shops and blacksmiths throughout the United States. Imported steel took six months to arrive in America and cost \$300 per ton on average.

The first step in making "The First Steel Ag Plow" was to obtain an old, tempered steel saw blade from a nearby river-powered lumber-making sawmill. Following that, the issue of forming the steel saw blade occurred. Due to its brittle nature, the steel was challenging to form into a curved shape. So the saw blade was cut into strips, and the strips were then welded into a thin piece of softer iron to address the blacksmith's challenge.

After that, "The First Steel Ag Plow" could be hammered into its appropriate shape. The end product underwent grinding and polishing until it was prepared for use. Next came the addition of the plow's wooden parts, consisting of the beam and the handle. The final test was seeing that "The First Steel Ag Plow" could actually pass through the prairie's soil successfully, thus leading to the conclusion that the invention was possible.

The truth is that (Black-

smith) John Lane Sr. never filed for a patent on his significant invention, despite reports that he produced 500 steel plows to fill orders, 200 of which were shipped to California to meet the state's early agricultural needs in 1854.

By way of my writer's pen, I'll continue here by offering some notable facts about (Blacksmith) John Deere, who in 1837 developed his version of the walk-behind 'Polished Steel Ag Plow' which became a turning point for farming. Notably, this is where (Storekeeper-Lumbermill Owner and Gristmill [Grinding Grain Mill] Operator) Leonard Andrus enters the 'Steel Ag Plow' scene with his capital to finance John Deere's fledgling operation, plus offering his business and sales experience to guide and promote things successfully forward.

In 1837, only one 'Steel Ag Plow' was manufactured; four more plows were produced in 1838. John Deere's little blacksmith shop got bigger in 1839 when a second forge was added, and 10 'Steel Ag Plows' were built and sold for twelve dollars each, equivalent in purchasing power to about \$403.00 in today's dollars. The dollar had an average inflation rate of 1.92% per year between 1839 and today, 2024, producing a cumulative price increase of 3,258.41% over 185 years.

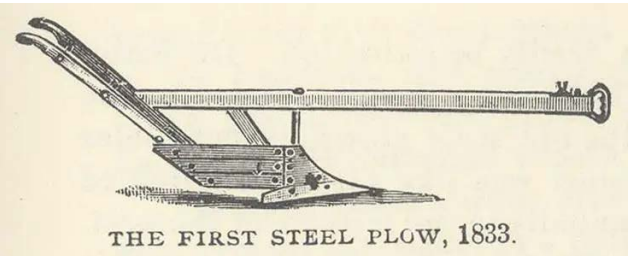
Every year after 1839, (Blacksmith) John Deere made more plows, and in 1843 he pro-

duced 400 'Steel Ag Plows', and became John Deere the manufacturer when he developed a partnership with John Gould and Robert Tate. They moved their small plant operations to Moline, Illinois, to expand the business. In 1849, a state-of-the-art factory was built in downtown Moline and began operation; plow production doubled in the first year. John Deere's workforce of about 16 employees built 2,136 'Steel Ag Plows' in 1849. By 1857 John Deere's

annual output of plows had risen to 10,000 units.

John Deere certainly understood the significance of filing for patents on all of his agricultural implements. He said, "I will never put my name on a product that does not have in it the best that is in me."

History always brings about an interesting study that frequently leaves me with more questions than answers. It's not different with this feature article "The First Steel Ag Plow".

Which came first, the chicken or the egg? Since God created animals first, according to Genesis, chickens came first. More significantly, God is the original cause of everything. "Who's on first?" "What's on second?" is a comedy routine made famous by the American comedy duo 'Abbott & Costello'. Who knows? Honestly, I have opened this feature article titled "The First Steel Ag Plow" with four notable, comedy-written questions to somehow connect with a humorous reference to my asking: Who was truly the first inventor of the Steel Ag Plow? Was it (Blacksmith) John Lane Sr. (1793-1857), (Storekeeper-Lumbermill Owner and Gristmill Operator) Leonard Andrus (1803-1867), (Blacksmith) John Deere (1804-1886), or perhaps the combined efforts of all three of these men?

There are those among historians who ascertain that the invention of "The First Steel Ag Plow" in 1833, should honorably and rightfully belong to John Lane Sr., Lockport-Joliet,

Illinois 30 miles southwest of Chicago.

There are stories from the past that say that when the native prairie soil was first broken, new crop cultivation called for some novel methods that had never been used before. The plow needed to turn the mat of prairie grasses so that the blades lay flat on top of one another. This was done to keep moisture in the furrow rather than in the then-abundant native grass. After the grassland was first plowed, a full year would often pass before a crop could be raised with some degree of success.




Ironically, the soil's richness was another issue that crop selection choices brought to the prairie farmers. In that early era of agriculture, farmers tried to use plows that were universally available to them at the time, those plow selections being either made from cast iron or wrought iron could not sufficiently cut the rich and deep native prairie loam soil. So how to clear the land/field

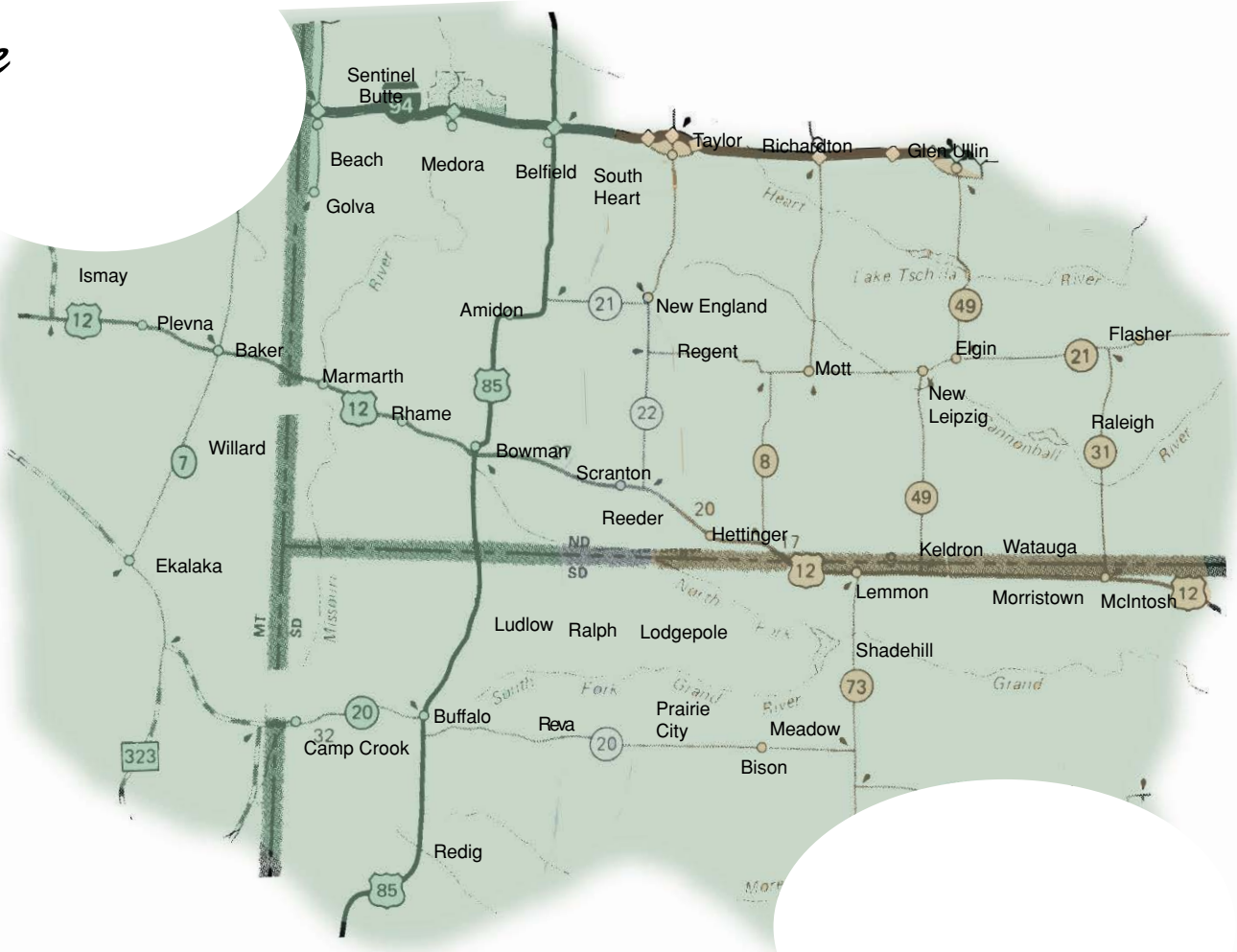
