"Thug" is defined as a violent, aggressive criminal. Originally, Sanskrit/Hindi meaning a member of a group of robbers in 19th Century India who waylaid and strangled their victims. The British solved that problem in the 1830's. But, words mean things! And, in this post-pandemic American culture we are seeing the offspring of these "care bear" movements who, first, change the language to change the hearts and minds of the public to our collective detriment. You know, like calling "inmates" in "prisons" (a derivative of the old term 'penitentiary' -a place to do penance and reflect on your crimes) as "residents" in "treatment" or in a "correctional facility". Such banal, nonthreatening terminology which totally ignores public safety but, creates the haze of tolerating criminal behavior. And, make no mistake, even the Century Code tries to spell out the correct terminology. So, it's the care bears and, not the Legislature, who creates the confusion. A wolf is a predator and not just a wild dog. And, knowledge is power. Ignore that to your peril.

Nowhere is this prevalent than in the "Juvenile Justice" movement where public safety appears to be a non-concern in comparison to a juvenile delinquent's (not "child in need of services") right to privacy. Case in point, Kansas City, Missouri, last week. I had just penned the praises of the Chiefs 2nd consecutive Super Bowl victory when, for the first time in NFL history, it is alleged that two juvenile delinquents, at a 1 million+ rally supervised by over 800 police officers, opened

fire killing a mother of 2 and wounding another 22 (ages 8 to 47). You would have thought national security prompted a lockdown for almost one week of the shooters' identities and, the actual facts. Why? And, as reported by ap news, "Defendants age 17...are typically adjudicated through the juvenile system, which is far more private than the system for adults. Names of the accused are not released, nor are police documents such as probable cause statements.' I'm sorry, but, why not? Why can't the names of these guys be redacted from the documents and, the information released for the public's protection in case there are other associate thugs out there?

Our local, Hettinger County public school administrations actually cooperate with law enforcement unlike my experience in other jurisdictions where a dean or superintendent erroneously thinks that the federal Family Educational and Privacy Rights Act of 1974 somehow creates a game preserve where their "students" are untouchable. In reality, nothing in this "funding" legislation (20 U.S. Code §1232[g]) says any such thing and, failing to cooperate is crime! Research the law yourself. When we fail to warn the public of the "facts" of a mass shooting, we fail to warn them of the other associated thugs who are, or may be, out there. Like in-Los Angeles, San Francisco, Austin, Chicago, New York, Detroit, ad nauseum. When is public safety going to be the Prime Directive again? Have a great

Rogation is from the Latin (having to do with law) In ancient Rome, it was a councils' or tribunes' proposal of a faw to be passed or rejected by the people. If they couldn't come to an agreement. they could 'hand it off to someone else.' Like your mortgage.

Definition: Council. Either of two magistrates of the ancient Roman republic. A magistrate was a civil officer empowered to administer law. The President is sometimes referred to as Chief Administrator of law.

We get the word magistrate from the word majesty. Originally, the word was applied only to God, but language changes every 50 years or so, so by now men have taken it upon themselves to be majestic. It's in the same category as the title, reverend. It appears only one time in the scriptures, and it refers to God Almighty and means, fear inspiring. Psm. 111:9 The Apostle Paul admonished us not to have the 'fear of men.' Why? Because they tend to make up the rules as they go irregardless of the laws of God. The great Jurist and writer of English law, Blackstone said, "All law comes from the original law set out in the Scriptures."

The council in civil council in Roman law is vague since the word civilian comes from the word civil. The law had to be approved by 'civilians.' Yet one of the laws in Rome was about taxation of civilians. It was called a head tax. If you didn't pay it, you got your head cut off. They were being civilized. Right? If you didn't or wouldn't (or couldn't) pay the head tax, you wouldn't be allowed to breath. This probably didn't apply to those with diplomatic immunity. I mean,

#### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We left off last time in the middle of a rather suspenseful situation. Ruth had proposed marriage to Boaz at the threshing floor. Though he was delighted and wanted to accept, he had to inform her that there was a nearer relative who would have to be given first choice of performing the duty of kinsman-redeemer. He told Ruth to lie down till morning, and we resume in Ruth 3:14, where we see a secret send-off: "So she lay at his feet until morning, and she arose before one could recognize another. Then he said, 'Do not let it be known that the woman came to the threshing floor." It is likely that neither Boaz nor Ruth slept very much that night, anticipating the events of the next day and wondering what the outcome might be. But even in the midst of such uncertainty, Boaz again demonstrates his integrity. He sends Ruth away secretly, wanting to avoid all appearance of seeming impropriety. This is a good reminder to believers in Christ to be careful about our testimony. I like the King James translation of 1 Thessalonians 5:22: "Abstain from all appearance of evil." As believers, we should not want to do anything that might bring dishonor to our

Very early the next morning, when it was time for Ruth to leave. Boaz would not let her go without a gift. We read in verse 15, "Also he said, 'Bring the shawl that is on you and hold it.'

And when she held it, he measured six measures of barley, and laid it on her. Then she went into the city."

The chapter ends with an account of the conversation between Ruth and Naomi. We can imagine how anxious Naomi was to know how things had turned out. We are told in Ruth 3:16-17, "So when she came to her mother-in-law, she said, 'Is that you, my daughter?' Then she told her all that the man had done for her. And she said, These six ephahs of barley he gave me; for he said to me, "Do not go empty-handed to your mother-in-law."" Here is some information we did not get from the account itself. Boaz is not just thinking of the woman he hopes to marry. He is such a gracious man that he is also considering Naomi and doesn't want Ruth to go home without something for her as well.

After hearing Ruth's account of how the night had gone, Naomi advised her daughter-in-law: "Then she said, 'Sit still, my daughter, until you know how the matter will turn out; for the man will not rest until he has concluded the matter this day' (verse 18).

Lord willing, next time we shall learn more of how the matter turned out. But I'd like to conclude by pointing out a lesson we can draw from Boaz's actions. You may recall that when Naomi returned to Bethlehem. she complained that she had come back empty. But that was no longer the case, thanks to the generosity of Boaz. And here again we see it. Boaz did not let Ruth go home empty-handed; he lavished her with an abundance of grain. What a picture




