

It's time to start planning for North Dakota's largest rummage sale event, the annual Highway 21 Treasure Hunt, scheduled for 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. MT Friday and Saturday, June 21-22.

"Now is the time to start planning your sale by marking your items, finding a location and calling the community organizers to be listed," shares Luann Dart, who coordinates the event.

Participating communities holding citywide rummage sales include Flasher, Carson, Elgin, New Leipzig, Mott, Regent and New England. Heil typically has sales and rural residents are welcome to host sales, too.

Anyone holding a sale is encouraged to stay open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. MT both days. Those who plan to have their sale during different hours should state those hours on the listing.

"It's discouraging for folks to drive to our communities and find that some sales have closed early, so we need to try to avoid that," Dart says.





information from your inner ears, your vision, and input from your joints about their position and movement to keep you balanced and stable. Typically, all of this information paints the same picture for your brain. If your brain gets conflicting information – say, your inner ear sends different information than vision and your joints - that often results in a feeling of dizziness, unsteadiness, or vertigo. Your physical therapist will ask questions about your history and then test all of the systems that help you stay balanced to determine the cause of your dizziness.

Your treatment plan will vary depending on what your PT finds. Some typical examples include:

- **Exercises:** Your PT may prescribe specific exercises to improve your balance, strengthen or stretch specific muscles, or help retrain your brain to interpret sensory information. These can include gaze stabilization exercises, which help your eyes and inner ears work better together; habituation exercises, which help your brain get used to different types of input; and balance training on various surfaces.
- **Canalith repositioning maneuvers (CRM):** If your dizziness is caused by benign paroxysmal positional vertigo (BPPV), a specific type of inner ear problem, your therapist may perform maneuvers to reposition tiny crystals

Finding Balance: Dizziness and PT

Dizziness is common in people over 20, and it can be a big problem in daily life. Feeling unsteady, lightheaded, or like the room is spinning is alarming and makes daily tasks difficult. The good news is that dizziness often has treatable causes, and your physical therapist can be the perfect person to help.

Understanding Dizziness

Dizziness isn't a specific problem—it's a symptom that can be caused by many different issues. Feeling dizzy most commonly occurs due to issues with the inner ear, but it can also occur due to vision, joint or muscle issues in the neck, migraines, changes in blood pressure, head injuries, or other neurological problems.

How Physical Therapists Help

To understand dizziness and how a PT can help, you must know a little about how balance works. Your brain uses

within your ear canal, alleviating your vertigo. They can also teach you how to do these at home.

- **Education:** Your therapist will educate you about your condition, how to manage dizziness, and exercises you can perform at home. They may also help you modify activities that cause dizziness or train you on ways to work through it.

Dizziness doesn't have to interfere with life. Physical therapists can help reduce dizziness, improve balance, lower the risk of falls, and increase confidence in daily activities.

With much appreciation, we thank you over and over.

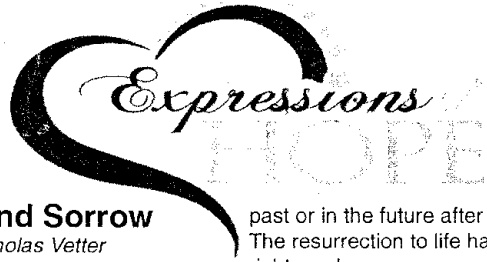

During my short time as a Catholic priest, I have experienced many joys in my life and in the life of my people. Birth, baptisms, marriages, first communion, and anniversaries are beautiful times of rejoicing.

At the same time, a priest experiences many sorrows and suffering in the lives of all people. These experiences only come to mind because we are in this time of Easter. Easter is the time of rejoicing in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. One great disconnect in the human heart is the lack of experiencing Jesus' resurrection as a real event, but more particularly, it is the seeming absence of the experience of the resurrection in the life of a Christian.

The resurrection from the dead, the resurrection of Jesus Christ are not events of the

past or in the future after death. The resurrection to life happens right now!

I remind you of the amazing and startling story from John 11, the Raising of Lazarus. As a brief recap of the story, Jesus shows up in Bethany after being called by Martha and Mary, his dear friends. At Jesus' arrival, he finds out that his friend Lazarus had died and had been in the grave for four days.

Martha, one of the most relatable characters in all the scriptures, comes to Jesus and enters into an intense dialogue with him. She is profoundly saddened by the death of her brother and tells Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

Did you read that? Reread it again. Martha believes in the resurrection from the dead, but Jesus corrects her. I find the next line to be one of the most fascinating in all of scripture: "I am the resurrection and the life."

Jesus has just identified himself as THE RESURRECTION! He doesn't just say the resurrection will happen, or after you suffer and die, you will experience the resurrection, but if you have faith in Jesus as a real living person, you can start to experience the resurrection now! Not tomorrow, not later, now!

In the very person of Jesus Christ, we will experience the resurrection. To say it another way, I will begin to experience the resurrection from the dead right now when I live in a true relationship with the living Jesus.

This brings me back to the beginning of this short piece. Easter makes clearer to me the need for people to experience the resurrected person of Jesus Christ because Easter draws a deep contrast between joy and sorrow, beauty and suffering. You are not alone in your suffering. Turn to the real living person of Jesus Christ and start to experience the resurrection!

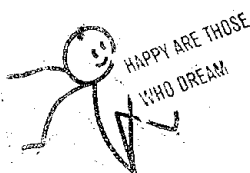

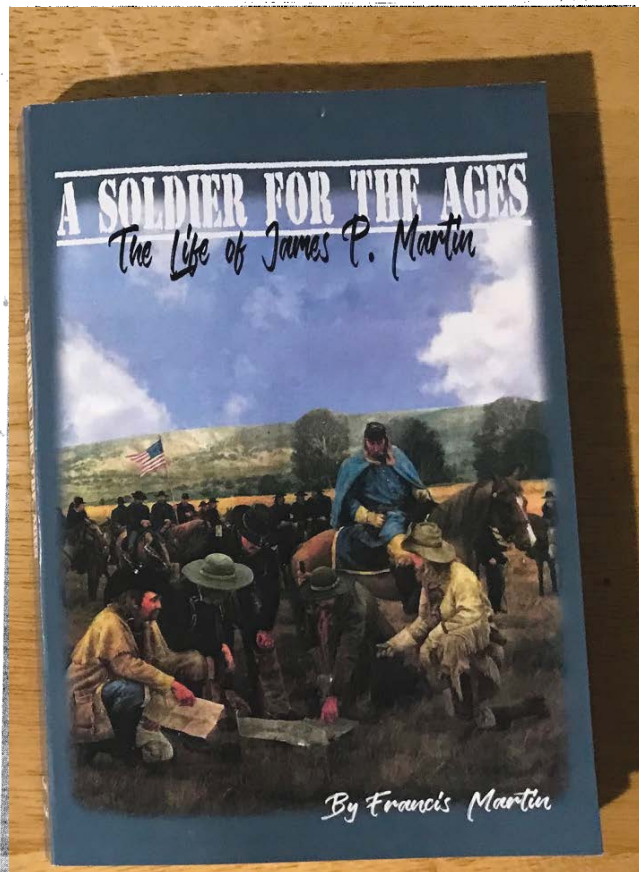

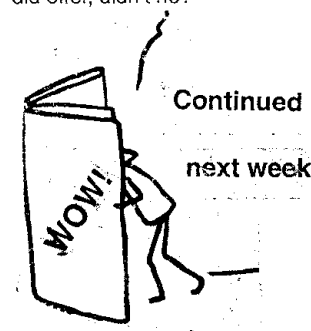
"Well, yeah, but there isn't any place around here that buys it, is there?"

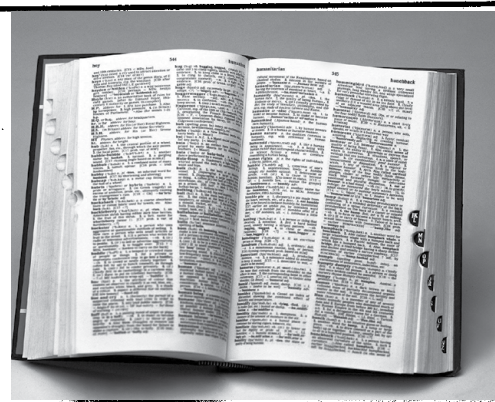

The crowd was listening intently until he began to explain about the resurrection of Christ. This was news to them. But what they said next showed that they had an agenda. They began to mock him and said, "We will hear you about this at another time."

An agenda is a list of things that have to be done at a meeting. These dissenters could hear and see that some of the Greeks were listening. It was not against Greek law to listen to Paul or anyone who could teach them something new. But...they already had a god for every god they had invented. Remember the silversmith who warned his employees that if Paul kept making disciples with this new teaching they would be unemployed?

So the dissenters had an agenda. Should they just wait and see whether or not very many people would convert to The Way before they took action? Or should they send a group of organized debaters to argue him away? When a well-versed local judge became a believer, (in order to stay in good stead with the law) they may have changed their agenda. The scriptures say that he 'went out of their midst'. The word agenda in this context is in the negative. Incidentally, the word agenda is not in the scriptures.



Shy at first, Charlie, Jaedyn and Willy's faces went from bashful to wonder-filled in the blink of an eye. There standing right in front of them as real as you and I were true Disney princesses. They hugged and held each of the girls while Eric from Make-A-Wish spoke softly muffling his own tears, Charlie and

A wake will be held at 7 p.m. Friday, May 31, at St. Vincent's Catholic Church in Mott, where a funeral service will be held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, June 1. He has been cremated and his ashes will be placed later that day in the Mott cemetery near a plot honoring his parents, Ted and Loraine Hardmeyer, and siblings who have passed before him.

He left the world on the same date as two of the most meaningful men in his life - his father, and his father-in-law, Marvin Daggett, who died unexpectedly in 1993.

Known always as Teddy, he was renowned for his love of and loyalty to his hometown of Mott, where he returned to live the past two decades of his life. He loved the town's history and all of its happenings, large and small, especially sports. He avidly followed the high school athletic teams and was a die-hard collector of cardinals for their association with the former Mott Lincoln High School mascot.

He was enthusiastic and passionate about so many things! He was a fisherman and a wildlife watcher, especially birds. He was an avid photographer and enjoyed traveling back roads in search of old farmsteads and schoolhouses, or sights of simple prairie beauty. He looked for the confluences of small streams and rivers, the two-track trails to the tops of buttes, the progress of crops, the formation of weather and sunsets, and the goings-on in the countryside.

He was always talking about his discoveries and tales of all the people in town and how they fit into the generations of Mott residents. He attended most funerals out of respect for the families and the deceased's relationship to himself, his parents or his friends.

He never met a stranger and he especially looked out for anyone with a special need, whether that need was their age, their different abilities, or their home circumstances. While in Mott, he worked at the Mott Senior Citizens Center Meals on Wheels program, the Enchanted Castle in Regent, and for several years up until his death, was a faithful substitute rural mail carrier. He served on the board of the Mott Gallery of History and Art and was also an avid reader, with most of his books donated to the Mott Public Library.

He owned several lawn-

mowers in various states of repair and disrepair, including a new one he bought just a couple of weeks ago. It can be safely said that no one in the town's history or its entire future has or ever will put on more miles or wear out more riding mowers than Teddy. He never saw a lot line he wouldn't cross if there was mowing needed on the other side. Full speed ahead was Teddy's motto and he was a familiar sight, buzzing around town wearing his noise cancelling headphones and old work clothes. He tried his best to help.

Teddy also struggled with alcohol abuse and mental and physical health issues. Those who knew and hopefully loved him understood his behavior could be erratic and sometimes hurtful. Where he failed, he hurt no one more than himself.

He died in Elgin's newer hospital, blocks away from the old one where he was born on Aug. 27, 1955, the eighth of 12 children. He graduated from Mott Lincoln High School with his beloved class of 1973 and went on to receive an associate degree at Bismarck State College and four-year degree at Moorhead (Minn.) State University in 1980.

He married Julie Daggett in 1977 and the couple had two sons, Gabriel and Seth. They lived in Moorhead, with strong associations to St. Joe's Catholic Church and parish, and the school, and where Teddy's successful career in business and sales included management work at JC Penney, Computerland, as well as Fargo Molding, Inc., and SJ Electro Systems.

He formally retired to Mott in 2006. He was a devoted father and family man in his best years.

He will be deeply missed in our hearts, out on the back roads and where the grass grows high.

He is survived by his ex-wife, Julie; his son Gabe (Anita) and their daughters, Grace, Lily and Juliet, of Naples, Fla; his son, Seth (Kari), of Frazee, Minn., their children Faith (Kyle) Kern, Hannah Conway (Carson Alger), Colton Conway, and Lillian Adams, and grandchildren Hadley and Landon Kern. He is also survived by his brothers, Kent, Steve and Evan; his sisters Judith Hardmeyer-Wright, Jane Baker, Maribeth Hardmeyer, Lauren Donovan, and Andrea Bacik; and many beloved nieces and nephews both Hardmeyers and Daggetts.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his sisters, Denise and Lisa, his brother, Eric, and his Mott grandparents Carl and Katharine Hardmeyer.

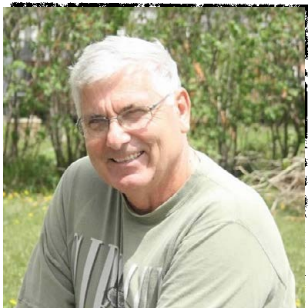

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have begun looking together at 1 Peter 1:2: "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied." We have considered the wonderful things which Peter says are true of the suffering believers to whom he is writing. Their lives had become very difficult because of their faith in Jesus Christ. This had brought them into conflict with the world around them which was hostile to the gospel. This has always been and always will be the case with those who boldly live for Christ. Jesus told His disciples in John 15:18-19, "If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you."

Peter knew the most comforting thing any believer could know. By reminding them that they were God's elect, he was telling them that whatever they were facing in this present life could never change the fact that they were the special objects of God's love. Though God allows His people to suffer, their sufferings are being used to accomplish the work of His Kingdom. And most comforting of all is this: Because election is entirely a matter of God's sovereign choice, it will always stand. His people are secure forever.

But there is something else these believers need to know: Election leads God's people to demonstrate evidence of their election. The elect always come to faith in Jesus Christ. And let us never forget that this is a mighty miracle of the Holy Spirit. It is God changing the very nature

of an individual and putting new life into his or her soul (John 3:3-8; John 6:63). A person who has undergone such a miraculous change cannot remain the same. The apostle Paul says in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." And we see in our passage the first fruit of this new life: "sanctification of the Spirit." One meaning of "sanctification" is "dedicated to God." It is a synonym for "holy," or "set apart to God." In our verse Peter is saying that God's electing His people includes His setting them apart for Himself. Believers, we do not belong to ourselves. God not only chose us to be His own, but He also paid the great price to make us His own by giving His Son to die for us and pay the penalty which our sins deserved so that we could be forgiven and made His children. We read in 1 Corinthians 6:19-20: "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."

Belonging to God is both a privilege and a responsibility. It means that we are special to Him, but it also means that we represent Him. If we are professing to be believers in Christ, we are saying that we belong to God. And this should make an obvious difference in our lives.

There is a second meaning of the word "sanctification," which, Lord willing, we shall consider next time. But I close by asking you to examine yourself. If you have not placed your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God, please do so before it is too late. It is a matter of eternal consequence. And if you are a believer in Christ, seek God's grace daily to make your life more and more set apart for Him.

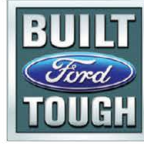
