#### Introduction

Cs a journalist, writer, teacher, announcer, publicist and motivational speaker I apply Faith and the 3 "P's" on a daily basis. God has blessed me with many gifts. Thanks to no goodness of my own, of course. We all have special gifts given to us from "Our Most High." Whether we decide to use those special gifts is basically up to us.

Most people look at my life in amazement and say, "Gosh Sheila, you have accomplished so much at such an early age." My response is, "I live by Faith and the 3 "P's." Most people's reaction is typical of the reaction I gave my grandmother: "Faith and the 3 "P's," what's that?" Faith, Prayer, Persistence and Positive Thinking. Those four little words have taken me far. I have yet to experience just how far! Only God truly knows.

My grandmother's words of Faith and the 3 "P's" have enlightened my life spiritually, professionally and most important, personally. At this phase in my life, I apply the first "P" – prayer – 24-hours a day. The first thing I do when I wake up is pray. If you don't pray people, how can you expect results? If you don't pray, you have already lost the battle. Also, if you don't pray with conviction and with an honest heart, how can you expect anything from God? I have accomplished much by the "Power of Faith and the 3 P's." The "Golden Rule of Faith and Prayer" was handed down to me from my grandmother. I hope my grandmother's "Golden Rule of Faith and Prayer" will also help you fulfil all of your dreams. If you ask God to plan and guide your life. He will help you accomplish your dreams.

In 1992, I realized the power of faith and prayer in my life. It was then that I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. I was attending Brookland Baptist Church in Columbia, SC at the time. My pastor was Rev. Charles Jackson. He was also a co-worker at WOIC-AM, the station where I got my first job.

I was so overly confident at this time. I thought, "Hey, I'm 22 years old, attractive, with a college degree and some insight on how the radio and records industry works, what's the problem?"

I continued praying, asking God to lead me and guide my path. I was literally praying 10 times a day. I ended up taking on two part-time jobs just to survive. My hope never ended during my moment of despair, it only made me stronger. I had to apply for unemployment at one point, but throughout that period of unemployment, my prayer life increased. I could see success, but yet it wasn't in existence. I must admit my faith was fading. I wanted to be a "Radio Star!" I could hear my grandmother's words so clearly during my moment of "Going Through." "Keep praying, and believing. God will do it for you."

No matter how hard I prayed, or believed, answers were not coming. I scheduled a meeting with Rev. Jackson. He said, "Sheila, the problem is 'YOU' are not praying right." I looked at him in total amazement. How could he be telling me, I wasn't praying right? "God may want you to be more than just a

"Radio Star." Maybe he wants you to be a writer, a motivational speaker, a teacher, a promoter, or even a publicist. You are an excellent organizer and speaker. Instead of asking God for what You want, ask him what he wants 'YOU' to do." Basically, he was saying to me, "Keep praying and believing, but "CHANGE" the way you are PRAYING!" So from that moment on, I did. Instead of asking God to make me a "Radio Star," I asked him to lead and guide me to do His will. Immediately, He started sending people and opportunities my way.

During this time, God not only sent people my way, but He also made me stronger and blessed me with the gift of being a writer, promoter, teacher, motivational speaker. All the things Rev. Jackson talked to me about were beginning to manifest right before my eyes. I became a "Messenger" for God. When I changed the way I was praying God moved me in the right direction. Blessings started to flow left and right. The Lord blessed me with a writer's job at a local newspaper. I was also blessed with "many" speaking engagements at several schools and churches. Throughout various ways of networking and trying to secure a good paying radio job, God blessed me with the knowledge of setting up promotional deals by way of radio, television and print. Little did I know, I was well on my way to becoming that promoter and publicist Rev. Jackson envisioned.

I even found myself reaching out to people who were veterans in the industry and asking them how they achieved success. God was moving me in the right direction in all aspects of my life.

Instead of sending out two tapes a month to radio stations around the country, my "Spirit" led me to send 15. Keep in mind, my life still wasn't set on a golden plateau. I

continued to struggle to make ends meet, but I was happy because I was praying "RIGHT," and "TRUSTING" God totally.

My prayers became even more pure and honest. He was listening and the results continued to come. The rejections also continued to come. One particular week, I received 9 rejection letters a day from different radio stations around the country. I was totally discouraged, however, not dismayed.

Throughout it all, I maintained my grandmother's "Golden Rule of Prayer and Faith." I continued praying and asking God to lead my life, and career, and He did. I realized that Sheila Stewart's life was now God's life. It was my decision to follow Him, and not me. Have you ever received or won a prize and felt a tremendous sense of pride afterwards? I felt that way after knowing God was in control. I believed and begin to see success in achieving my goals. He was preparing me to do and be something "Greater." My community work locally, and nationally is a reward of the trials the Lord allowed me to endure. If I would have stop praying and believing, I would not be the person I am today.

As my career continued to rise, I could also see other aspects of my life change. I no longer desired to fulfill Sheila's ambitions. I became a "Messenger" for God by way of community service. As the News and Public Affairs Director at WPEG-FM, my job influences, helps and changes people's lives. God has made it my civic duty to help all people. I surpassed the goal of spotlighting more than 450 organizations over the airwaves in one year. Wow!! Can you just imagine the countless amount of people who were helped from that effort? # Part Two The Golden Rule of Persistence

**J** had to maintain a persistent spirit early in my career to fully understand how to achieve the impossible. When someone tells me, "No," I have learned throughout my life and career not to accept it. Being rejected time and time again was a good thing for me because it made me go back and reevaluate why I was denied in the first place.

After getting so many rejection letters in the early phase of my career, I was discouraged at first, but I went back and asked God to show me where I went wrong and how to become better. My grandmother's "Golden Rule of Persistence" again came into the picture.

I applied for the News Director's position at WPEG-FM not once but twice. The first time was in 1991. I wasn't ready for the job. I went back and sharpened my skills so that I would be able to fully handle the job when I was given the opportunity again. I was persistent. Remember all of those rejection letters I mentioned in Part One? Two of them came from WPEG-FM.

In life you either accept rejection and accept being told, "No," or allow God to work it for your good.

No matter how hard you have tried to enter a peak of arrival in any field, whether it's dance, music, art or entertainment, if you accept rejection you will never make it. I would recommend stepping back a moment and use what Rev. Jackson told me, "Change the way you are praying. Maybe God doesn't want you to be a singer (no matter how well you can sing). He could be steering you in the direction of a songwriter.

Or if you are a dancer, and you can't land your feet on a solid stage, maybe God wants you to use your gift to be a choreographer.

I have always wanted to work in the broadcasting industry. It was difficult in the beginning, but I refused to hear the word no. Instead of giving up, I accepted the fact that working as a radio announcer wasn't God's plan for me at the time. When I truly believed that in my heart and used the other gifts he blessed me with, doors started opening. I became a writer, a publicist, a motivational speaker and even a promoter. I use the God-given abilities He blessed me with, and turn them around for "MY" good. All of them!

In 1993, I was working at WQOK-FM in Raleigh as a News and Public Affairs Director. I had only worked there for a year or so. However, my Spirit was leading me to see if I could land another job in a bigger market LIKE Chicago, Atlanta, Washington, Los Angeles, Dallas, and New York.

I went back and applied the ingredients of persistence. I submitted more than 25 samples of my tape monthly – nationwide. If you want to achieve anything in life you must give it your best shot at all times.

I begin to think of creative ways to get Supervisors to hear me. I prayed and asked God to show me how to get their attention. One night I called two of my mentors and sought advice. One was Russ Parr who is heard on more than 15 stations nationwide as a Syndicated Radio Announcer, and the other Doug Williams of KISS-FM in Columbia, SC.

I said, "Guys, I am sending out countless tapes again and no one is responding." They both said, "Well Sheila, sending out tapes is good but to really get their attention submit a critique sheet along with your tape and ask them to rate your ability on overall sound, delivery, writing ability, etc." I listened in total amazement, the same way I did to Rev. Jackson. In my

Spirit I was saying, "You are telling me to send out a critique sheet?" Here are two guys telling me the same thing. What more could I ask for?

At this point, my work experience had many years into the industry. I thought I was good and I had paid my dues, you know? I thought I was the "Bomb" as a Morning News Announcer, and Public Affairs Director . . . at least I thought? I took their advice and personally developed a critique sheet. It read as follows:

Dear Elroy Smith, Operation Manager, WGCI-FM. I have admired your work history in the industry for a long time. I know you are busy but if you could please take a moment, and critique my work and show me how to land a job in a bigger market.

Please rate my work on a scale of 0-10.

- 1. Sound
- 2. Delivery
- 3. Personality
- 4. Writing Ability
- 5. Overall Performance

People, not only did he respond; he offered me a JOB!!! I said . . . Wow . . . look at God! I could be living and working in Chicago! Not only did I get an offer from him, but also got other job offers, from around the country.

It did not stop there. I was also offered a National Writing job as a columnist at a Black Music Trade Magazine, a magazine that is read around the world. It's now called B.R.E., based in Los Angeles. I met the owner at a radio function and told him that I was a writer. He requested a copy of my writing samples. He wanted them within a week. By maintaining my persistent Spirit, I not only sent him samples of my writing by Fed-Ex the next day, but I also sent him one dozen roses

expressing my thanks and gratitude for being considered. I was also offered a National Radio Job as a Correspondent heard by 15 million people around the world at American Urban Radio Networks and ABC Radio News in New York.

You see, people, just because you have been granted an opportunity, don't just settle for that. Go far and above to reach your dreams. God will bring them to pass.

At this point, my life and career were on the uprise. I was considering the job in Chicago, writing for a National Magazine read by 3 million and working as an International Correspondent.

Just when I thought life was going great for me, it only got BETTER!! I thought about the many nights I prayed asking God to perform his will in my life. I never had any idea, how great God's will was for me. When I allowed him to take over, "Glory be to God." He did. I thought about the struggles, the rejections and hearing the word, "No" over and over. Through it all, I stayed persistent and the results have manifested through my hard work.

Just when I thought all was well, a difficult moment was about to come in my life. The job offer at WGCI-FM was still standing and I didn't know if I should take it or not. I prayed and asked God to show me what to do. My mind was all made up to take the job and then came a call from WPEG-FM. How about that? Talking about God's plan not be your plans. God had thrown a "Monkey Wrench" in my plans and now He expected me to make the righteous decision. Would I go for fame and fortune, or would I allow him to perform his ultimate will for my life? How could God expect me to make such a decision. How did he know in the end, I would choose His will? The answer is simple. He's God. He knows all things. God knew in the end I would choose him over "Me."

You see, folks, instead of accepting "No" from WPEG-FM and all the other stations that turned me down, I moved forward. I applied my gifts on to bigger and better things. I refused to allow the Devil to stop me from reaching my goals. God said, I could have my heart's desire, and I was going to get it. Too bad Satan, "You lost this fight." My friend, just because you receive a rejection don't give up, that opportunity may present itself again.

I had a decision to make. Should I accept the offer at WGCI-FM in Chicago or should I move to a smaller market, like Charlotte? I thought hard and prayed fervently. I called Elroy Smith for WGCI-FM in Chicago, and literally "Cried" on the telephone when I told him I was accepting the job in Charlotte, a much smaller market. He said to me, "Truly my sister whatever you do, follow God's will for your life." My response was, "Yes, I will!" I didn't know what to expect, but I continued to pray, believe God, remain persistent and exhibit positive thinking. I don't care what anyone says, it's hard to turn down a job in a big city like Chicago. I was going to be making "Big" money for a change? As usual, God's will for my life has given me more than fame, fortune, and a "Big" name. It has brought me into the greater promise of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I am finally seeing his "Glory" in my life. Oh what "Joy," when you walk in the perfect will of God for your life. I did not say the decisions you would have to make would be easy, but I will tell you, they're well worth the sacrifice.

I decided to move to Charlotte and see what God had in store. God brought me to Charlotte more than six years ago and it has been so sweet!!! My persistent Spirit grew even stronger after accepting the job at WPEG-FM.

I was following God's will not my own. I continued to network and further myself by way of career and professional growth. I went to every Radio and Records convention in the U.S. – Los Angeles, Atlanta, Chicago, New Orleans, and New York. Just because God was moving in all areas of my life, I still strived to be better. "Faith without works is dead." You can believe God is going to perform great things in your life, but if you don't pursue them they will never manifest.

I met Record Company Presidents, Vice Presidents, Entertainers, and Singers, anybody who was influence to help me along the way. At one point, I had collected over 3000 business cards, and phone numbers of influential people. I realized if any door of opportunity was blocked at this point, I allowed it. I was using the God-given ability to maintain a persistent Spirit and it was working for my good. That is why I have helped many who have come my way. During my tenure at WPEG-FM/WGIV-AM, I have acquired a full news staff of reporters, many searching for a chance in the industry.

There are many great women, who have mastered the art of persistence and refusing to accept rejection. Some of these women are:

Hattie Leeper, the first Black female radio announcer in North Carolina and the owner of The Chatty School of Communications;

Diane Tucker, Vice President and General Manager of WPEG-FM/WBAV-FM/WGIV-AM, and the first Black female for Infinity Broadcasting, one of the largest owned broadcasting conglomerates in the United States; and

Mary MacMillan, the first female General Manager for Jefferson Pilot's WBTV New Channel 3 in Charlotte.

All these women are pioneers of greatness, with persevering spirits. They never gave up the faith, but they pressed toward the prize of excellence. I have said all of this to express the importance of staying persistent. If you are in a state of giving up, on your dream – DON'T!! Ask God to show

you how to get there and give it your all. During my darkest hour of giving up on my dreams, God stepped in and prepared me for the impossible and made it possible!!

Then God said, "Step back for a moment and see what this relationship is doing to you. It's destroying you." I asked God why the relationship is not working? I said, "I'm giving this relationship everything I have — my heart, my mind and my soul. What God, please tell me, show me what to do?"

One day I went to my current pastor, Rev. Claude Alexander (University Park Baptist Church) about the problem and he said: "Sheila, you want this relationship to work but God may not. He could have someone else out there for you, someone stronger, greater, and better. Instead of asking God to fix the relationship or send you a man, ask him to prepare YOU for the man he wants you to have." I looked at him in total amazement. The light had come on. Not only what my Pastor said was right, but God spoke a deeper word to me. He said, "Sheila, it is my desire that you have someone, but this is not the time or season, I have so much that I want to accomplish in you, and through you. Right now, in your life, I want "ALL" of you, to myself. I am jealous, and I don't want to share you with anyone. I can't allow you to love anyone more than you "Love" me. And you know that you loved that man more than you loved me. You gave him my time. You gave him my finances. You sang him my praises. My name is "Jealous," and I won't share you with another. I want you to be so in love with me that when I send you your husband, you won't get off track. You'll be able to stay focused on what I have ordained for you to do. My dear, you'll know when it's from me because he won't pull you out of my will. He'll help usher you further into my presence. The vision is only for an appointed time, at the end it shall speak and not lie. Wait my child on the promise of God. For it shall come to pass." Man, what a revelation from Heaven!!

So I changed the way I was praying to God. Instead of asking him to repair my relationship, I asked him to give me strength to end it and wait until He was ready for me to have the man he had ordained for me. Right now, someone reading this book is going through what God delivered me out of. I encourage you to walk away right now. NO, it won't be easy, but you can do all things through Christ Jesus, who gives you strength. Yes, you will shed some tears, but in the end it's going to work for your good. I know it may not look like it now but from my experiences, God will wipe every tear from your eyes. In time, this trial will just be a faded memory. Take God for his word.

That was the second most difficult decision I had to make in my life because I was truly in love. I stopped searching for answers. I decided to step back and wait on God. I examined Faith and the 3 "P's" and looked at why that relationship didn't work out. First, I prayed and asked God to send me a man; however, my prayers were not honest. I requested for just a man, and that's what I got — A MAN!! I didn't ask specifically for what I needed or wanted. This is where persistence came into play. I also did not ask the will of God for my life.

Remember in previous chapters how I asked God to make, Remember in previous chapters how I told you I asked God to make me a "Radio Star?" You see He had bigger plans for me. Instead of making me a "Radio Star," He made me a teacher, a promoter, a writer, and announcer and publicist —

far greater than I had even asked. So, can you imagine what He has in store for me when it comes to my mate? God will knock our socks, if we just wait!!!!!

I based my past relationship on those justifications. No matter how hard I tried to please my friend, he never appreciated it or was satisfied? Why? Because it was Sheila's plan, not God's. To the single men and women out there, I simply say, "Hang in there." Your past relationship did not work out because God has another plan. He is preparing you for something greater!!

Right now, I'm enjoying being single. It can be frustrating, but I am not discouraged. I know that God has the right "Man" out there for me. I thank "Him" for my last relationship.

I have come to realize that a person enters your life for a positive reason. If your career or relationship didn't work out keep in mind that person or situation rescued you. That situation helped you by increasing your faith, changing the way you pray, maintaining persistence and thinking positive. It's our adversities that makes us stronger. It's during these times we fully see the "Glory" of God at operation in our lives. It's when we're at our lowest, God's at his best. He has been preparing you all these years for his ultimate will for your life. God wants to use you and HE doesn't have time for you to keep going around the same mountain over and over. It's time to come up higher into the Master's will. Are you ready? Don't be afraid! God will lead the way. Keep thinking positive. You're almost there. Move forward. The promise is at hand.

### Conclusion

Faith and The 3 "P's" changed my life!!!! I am the CEO/Owner of S&S Marketing where I work as a publicist for Muhsin Muhammad and Kory Minor of the Carolina Panthers; Rhonda Mapp of the WNBA L.A. Sparks; National Comedian and "Kings of Comedy" Star Tone-X, WPEG personalities Nate Quick, No Limit Larry and "Fly-Ty" and Olympic and Professional Boxer Calvin Brock — (Thank you for being a wonderful friend).

By applying Faith and the 3 "P's" in my life, I am also an adjunct professor of Journalism at Johnson C. Smith University and the Chatty School of Communications. More than 20 students have been awarded college scholarships (more will be awarded) by the Sheila Stewart Education Foundation of which I am the Executive Director.

Over 20 young girls in the Charlotte area are now proud college students and working class professionals because I have shared with them the 3 "P's" and spent time mentoring them. I have also received accolades of National Awards and Local Honors. God has richly blessed me.

When I look back at my life, I wonder sometimes in amazement and say, "Wow, grandma Faith and the 3 "P's" changed my life." I hear her words and I am in total astonishment, at the move of God in my life. If you are reading this book and saying the same thing, I would say to you, "Don't think twice. Allow God to have complete dominion over your life. He will take you to heights unknown. Trust God and do not doubt."

I am happier now, than I've ever been. Going through tough times made me stronger, wiser and more appreciative of the things of God. I never take an open, or closed door for granted. If it's closed and God doesn't give me the key to open it, I accept that it's not his will for me to walk in it. If He opens a door for me, I do not hesitate, I seize the moment because I may not have that opportunity again.

Faith and the 3 "P's" have allowed me to share my knowledge with others, just as I'm sharing with you. It made a difference in my life. Allow God to do the same thing in your life. Keep moving forward. The prize is at hand.


She also set up The Sheila Stewart Education Foundation, a charitable organization devoted to helping minority students attend college.
