With 2:49 left in the third period, the Oilers regained the lead, 15-14, as **Ed Nelson** capped a 59-yard march from four yards out, but Schenauer secured the Shamrocks' sixth win and second spot in the EFL standing on a sneak with 9:23 remaining in the final period.
