Long time between downs for Oilers

MIDDLEBORO — The Middleboro Cobras didn't miss a step after a two-day layoff between downs, as they scored in each quarter and cruised to a 28-7 Eastern Football League victory last night.

Rain suspended the game Friday

night, with Middleboro ahead, 7-0, but Randolph (1-2) tied it when it resumed with 3:16 left in the first quarter. Oiler Linebacker Bob Burr intercepted a Todd Levine pass and

returned it two yards for the touchdown. Al Media kicked the extra point to tie it, 7-7.

The Cobras (2-1) scored on two touchdown passes by Levine, in the second and fourth quarters, and a three-yard run by Tony DaRosa in the third.

The Randolph offense was left nearly helpless, mustering only 83 total yards, after quarterback Bob Witt was forced to leave with an

injury early in the second quarter.

The Oilers' defensive unit was strong, intecepting four passes and recovering three fumbles. Leo Cooney and Lester Pina each had two sacks for Randolph.
