Bob Turner will begin his third season as Head Coach of the Randolph Oilers with the help of a veteran staff of coaches. After finishing 1989 with an 8-3 record, Turner guided the team to an undefeated Championship season in 1990. Under the leadership of Fred Turner, the Oiler Receivers averaged 25 yards a catch during 1990. A former All League player, Coach Killinger put together a defense that allowed just 45 points during the 1990 regular season. Up front, Ed Penn led a very strong group of offensive linemen who provided great protection for the Oiler quarterbacks and helped the running backs to control the ball. On the other side of the ball, League M.V.P. Bill Turner will lead a group of intimidating Defensive players. Special teams under Coach Rodman have always played an important part in the Oiler success, whether it be by returning a punt deep in the opponent's territory or pinning the other team deep in poor field position. In 1991, the Oilers added a 10 year N.F.L. veteran to the staff in Jim Rourke, longtime player for K.C. Chiefs and Cincinnati Bengals. He will add experience and professionalism which is hoped to help lead the Oilers to another Championship in 1991. Collectively, the efforts of this staff is appreciated for all their time and hard work they put into this season.

Finally, as the season unfolds, former Oiler Jack Mitchell has been added to the coaching staff as special assignments and scouting personnel coach.
