

Oilers turn it around, win opener

Imagine how the Randolph Oilers felt Saturday when an official's inadvertent whistle resulted in the nullification of a 95-yard interception return for a touchdown by Teddy Green.

Imagine how they felt when, on the next play, Charles Williams ran 95 yards from scrimmage and scored anyway.

From the depths to the heights, the Oilers nevertheless began their Eastern Football League season on a high note, upending the New Hampshire Wolfpack, 28-3.

Williams led the Oilers with 165 yards on three carries, Jim Callahan of Randolph adding 45 yards and a touchdown on two carries in his first EFL game. Meanwhile, playing in his first game, quarterback Chris Pryor tossed two touchdown passes, one of 10 yards to Braintree's Brian Berg and another of 11 yards to Derrick Epps. Pryor completed four of six attempts.

The Oilers limited the Wolfpack to one field goal, receiving leadership from Fred Turner, who had an interception and a fumble recovery. Al Casey, John Gallo and Chris Torem each recorded a sack.

The Oilers play next at 7 p.m. Saturday at Battis Field, Middleboro.
