EFL ADVANCE

The EFL will be sporting a new look this year. The league will expand from nine to 14 teams, and will be divided into two divisions: the Eastern and Northern Conferences.

The increase of new teams will give the league more exposure and create new rivalries within the league, such as the new Quincy team versus Randolph, and the Boston Cowboys. Quincy had a very good team in its first year as a member of the New England Football League.

There is also a merger of two teams this year, with the EFL Maine Blizzard joining forces with a new team entry from Clinton, which will be known as the Clinton Irish Blizzard. Some say the Clinton-Maine merger will be a dark horse in the league with last years Blizzard the most improved team in the league. It will take time for some of the other teams to build competitive teams.

The Marlboro Shamrocks, the EFL champions for the past nine consecutive years, along with some national championships, still appear the team to beat again this year, as the Shamrocks are returning with depth and experience.

The Middleboro Comets, always a strong contender, are looking to win the big one, having been the only team to beat the Shamrocks the last two years (9-7), (15-14), and, had stopped the Shamrocks 54 game win streak in 1998. Last year, Middleboro almost upset the Shamrocks in the playoffs for the EFL title. Middleboro was leading Marlboro 14-13 with 1:13 left in the game, when the Shamrocks scored on a 17 yard TD run and a PAT rush.

Other contenders include the Boston Cowboys and the Randolph Oilers. The Oilers could improve with the addition of some key players. Last year they lost five games by five or less points, and lost to Marlboro in the playoffs 21-17. The Boston Cowboys are always a threat, with a large number of seasoned players, and a team that does not allow many points to be scored against them.

The Central Maine Storms and Southern Maine Raging Bulls merged this year. Both teams finished with excellent records in the NEFL, with Maine Storm undefeated in 1999 and the Raging Bulls 8 - 2 the year before.

The new team from the Cape, The Hyannis Hurricanes, are well organized and have a large number of tryouts, and could well be a factor in this year's standings.

Another new team, the Mass Havoc, could surprise this year, after winning 2 national titles in the Double AA Minor League Football News

CLEATMARKS

Twenty-three individuals have been inducted into the American Football Association Hall of Fame, and 20 into the United States Football Association.

Records show that only 5 players have rushed for over 1000 yards or more in a 10 game season, the latest being Marlboro Shamrock's running back, Frank Bianchini, (a former Arena Player), who set a new record with 1210 yards, beating the old record held by Bernard Wiley by 18 yards.

Some of the exciting league records set (30) are: Longest EFL Win Streak—Marlboro (54 Games); Longest Punt Return—Mike Mulgrew, Hockomock (95 yards); Longest TD Reception —Ricky Witt, Randolph (97 yards); Longest Fumble Return—Chris Matosic, Medway (99 yards); EFL Rushing Leader—Jay Magee, Randolph (6000 yards); and Longest Kickoff Return—Bernard Lynch, Boston (102 yards).

Post season play is scheduled to start on Friday, September 29th. The top 4 finishers in each conference, and any team finishing with a .500 record will make the cut for post season play.

HISTORY OF THE LEAGUE

2000 - HAPPY BIRTHDAY EFL - 2000

When the Eastern Football League Teams make their debut on July 8th, the league will be celebrating its 40th Anniversary. Taking the field for the first time in 1961, the EFL continued while others failed, and now holds the distinction of being the oldest surviving amateur football league in the United States.

The EFL has gone through five name changes during the last 40 years, originally starting with the New England Football Conference, then going on to become the North Shore Football Conference, North Atlantic Football Conference, Eastern Pro Football Conference, and finally....."EASTERN FOOTBALL LEAGUE."

The EFL has had teams from 82 different towns, communities and cities, located in the states of Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey.

The EFL has also won nine national championships; the Mitchell Memorial Club of Middleboro in 1988, and the Marlboro Shamrocks, the other ten titles which included two titles in the same year, in both 1997 and 1999, when they captured the National Championships of both the "American Football Association" and the "United States Football Association."

A number of players have moved up to the pro ranks from the EFL and include Paul Lindquist (Vikings), Harry Crump (Patriots), Lance Olberding (Patriots and Bengals), Rod Choate (Patriots), Jim Bowman (Patriots), Mike Patrick (Patriots), AJ Smith (Buffalo Bills Personnel Director); while other pro-players, Jim Rourke, Mosi Tutupu, Ron Lippett, Rick Cash, and Lenny St. Jean have coached EFL teams. This year, Manny Pina of the Middleboro Cobras, a wide receiver and defensive back, will be playing with the Arena Football League's expansion team, Carolina Cobras, in North Carolina.

The longest continuous service to the EFL (40 years) is held by the Commissioner and new President, George E. Murphy, with former president and still Attorney at Law for the EFL, Paul Bartlett, who has served since 1965.

The winningest coach in the EFL is Marlboro Shamrocks Coach, Bob Brennan, who has won the EFL title for the last 9 consecutive years and has an overall record of 157-18-0, and eight national championships.....

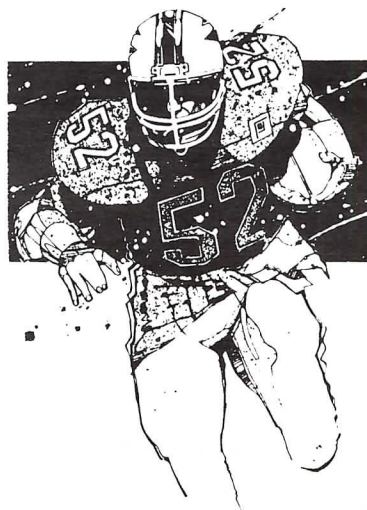
