

Randolph Oilers fall, despite solid game from QB Ryan Myers

The Randolph Oilers fell to 1-6 in the Eastern Football League on Friday night, dropping a 24-6 decision to the host Boston Panthers.

Boston jumped to an early lead on two Oiler turnovers.

Randolph drove to the Boston 35-yard line on its first possession before losing a fumble. The Panthers scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive.

The Oilers drove to the Boston 4 on their next series, but fumbled the snap on a field goal attempt. The Panthers ran a reverse on the first play from scrimmage and ran the ball back for an 88-yard touchdown.

Boston scored its final TD of the game to take a 21-0 lead into halftime.

Ryan Myers threw a second-half touchdown pass to Mackenzie Harrison for the Oilers' lone touchdown.
