Warren Whalers whip Randolph Oilers, 31-0

WARREN, R.I. — The Randolph Oliers suffered their third straight loss Saturday night at the hands of the Warren Whalers, 31-0, in an Eastern Football League game.

Chris O'Day accounted for two Whalers scores, one off a fake field goal attempt, and the Warren defense stymied the Oilers offense all night long as the Whalers raised their record to 4-1 on the season.

Warren jumped out to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter on a 10-yard jaunt by running back Steve Parker and incressed that margin to 18-0 by the half.

O'Day tossed a 16-yard scoring pass to Dave Pfaszek early in the second period off a fake field goal attempt to boost the Whalers lead to 12-0.

Late in the first half the Whalers upped their margin to 18-0 on a one yard dive by fullback Steve Barker, putting the Oilers in a halftime hole that they were una-

ble to come back from.

Things did not get any better in the second half as an interception by Warren set the Whalers up for their fourth score, a four-yard dash by reserve running back Charlie Edwards, putting the home team up 25-0.

Warren put its final score on the board late in the fourth quarter on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Paul Kelly to O'Day.

That score was set up when a bad snap to the Randolph punter resulted in a short punt that the Whalers were able to take advantage of.

Mistakes also plagued the Oilers all night long on offense as they were unable to sustain any sort of drive against a very tough and aggressive Warren defense.

Billy Turner was one of the lone bright spots for head coach Tom Pileski's club as he registered three quarterback sacks. Mike Pasquantino, Chip Howard, and Ed Nelson also had good games for the Oilers.
