Drew Summers will serve Clark, Lewis, Scotland, & Knox counties

Kahoka, MO – January 30, 2024 – Pheasants Forever and Quail Forever is excited to share that Drew Summers was hired for the Kahoka, MO., Farm Bill Wildlife Biologist I position. He started his new position January 14th.

The Farm Bill Wildlife Biologists on the Missouri team are partnership positions supported by the Natural Resources Conservation Service, the Missouri Dept. of Conservation, and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. Summers will work with private landowners in Clark, Lewis, Scotland, and Knox counties helping them with wildlife management planning and securing funds to help implement those plans.
