PASTOR'S PAGE

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we soak in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. The month of April provides us with the first 4 weeks when we will hear once again how Jesus makes faith happen by breathing the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and blessing them with peace. We will see and hear again how Jesus shows Thomas and all God's people that the life-changing resurrection embraces the wounds we all carry. God the Creator's peace, Jesus' wounds, and the breath of the Holy Spirit bring Thomas and us to believe that Jesus was raised from the dead. With Thomas we trust God to care for our bodies and our lives. We are encouraged as Jesus' relationship with Thomas reminds us how Jesus reaches for the outsiders like Thomas and us and restores us to our place in community.

The gospel for the 2nd Sunday in April is one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. Jesus shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures; the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

On the 3rd Sunday of April we consider the image of the good shepherd that shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, which gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. John will illustrate what it means for us to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.

The final Sunday in April provides us with an image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us—he is the vine we are the branches. "Apart from me you can do nothing" Jesus says. This is a difficult word for a self-reliant, individualistic culture such as our own, focused on personal achievement and success. We are reminded that God is the vine grower, Jesus is the vine, and we are the branches, that, if separated from the life-giving vine, can do nothing. Connected to Christ, we can do exceedingly abundantly beyond what we can ask or even think!

Yet, these are gracious, gospel words from Jesus. He's been preparing his disciples for years to take this step. These are words that point not toward individualistic, self-reliant independence but toward dependence on the one whose life defies death and whose perfect love casts out all fear. Connected to the vine, these branches are given a death-defying life free from fear. These gracious, gospel words from Jesus point to a community nourished by this life-giving vine and bearing fruit for the sake of the world.

We are alive in Christ and in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. We are reminded that Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. As always, fully nourished, we are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!
