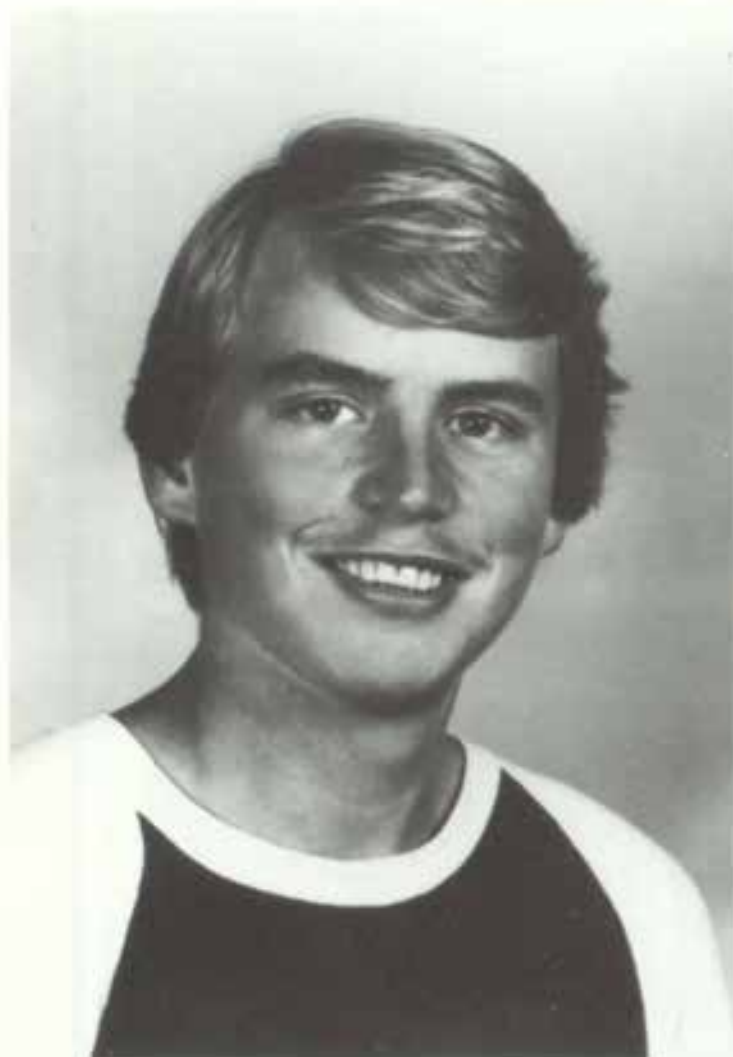


The Hoosick Falls Central Alma Mater
