



# 3-PEAT! GOLF



Much more work goes into the yearbook than most people think. The graphic design on the next page is a duplicate of the directions for this page as it was sent to the publishing company. 



HOOSICK FALLS, N.Y. — Hoosick Falls native George P. Verschoor of Los Angeles, Calif., was nominated by the Academy of Arts and Sciences for an Emmy Award, the highest award in television. The 43rd annual Emmy Awards is broadcast Sunday, Aug. 25.

Verschoor was chosen for his editing on the television special "The Magic of David Copperfield," which aired last winter. Verschoor attended Hoosick Falls Central School and graduated from Hoosac School in 1978.

He went on to earn a degree in broadcasting and communications at Syracuse University. In 1983 he moved to Los Angeles to pursue his career in television. His work includes productions of "Lonesome Dove," "Entertainment Tonight," "The Sunday Comics," and "The New Leave It To Beaver."

He was coordinating producer of "American Families." Verschoor, who works and lives in California, returns often to visit friends and family in East Hoosick.

Although all of you have had special times where you shined, there are a few people I need to thank for creating some of the highlights in my time here.
