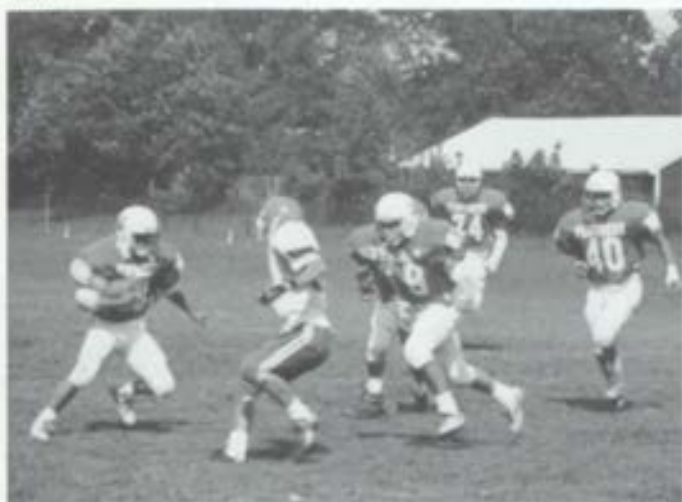

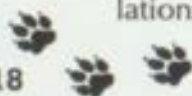

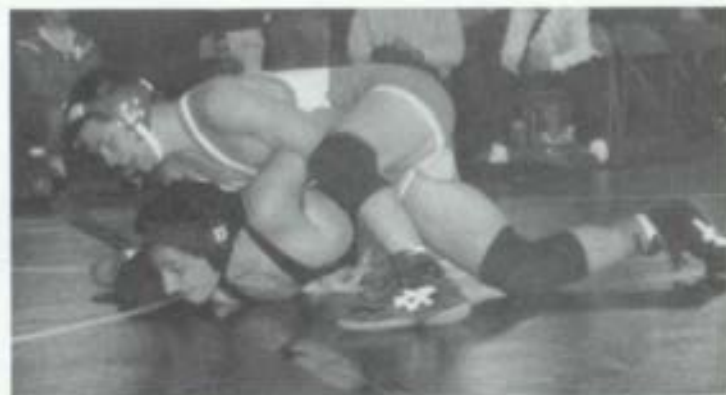

Much more work goes into the yearbook than most people think. The graphic design on the next page is a duplicate of the directions for this page as it was sent to the publishing company. This is what goes into each yearbook page. First, the pictures have to be taken. Verschoor was chosen for his editing on the television special "The Magic of David Copperfield," which aired last winter. Verschoor attended Hoosick Falls Central School and graduated from Hoosac School in 1978.

He went on to earn a degree in broadcasting and communications at Syracuse University. In 1983 he moved to Los Angeles to pursue his career in television. His work includes productions of "Lonesome Dove," "Entertainment Tonight," "The Sunday Comics," and "The New Leave It To Beaver."

He was also coordinating producer of "American Families." Verschoor, who works and lives in California, returns often to visit friends and family in East Hoosick.

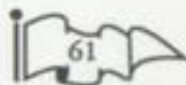

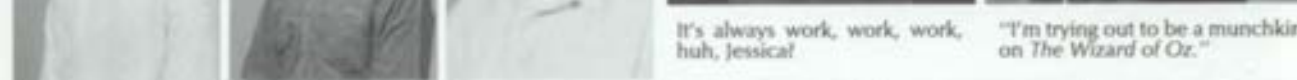

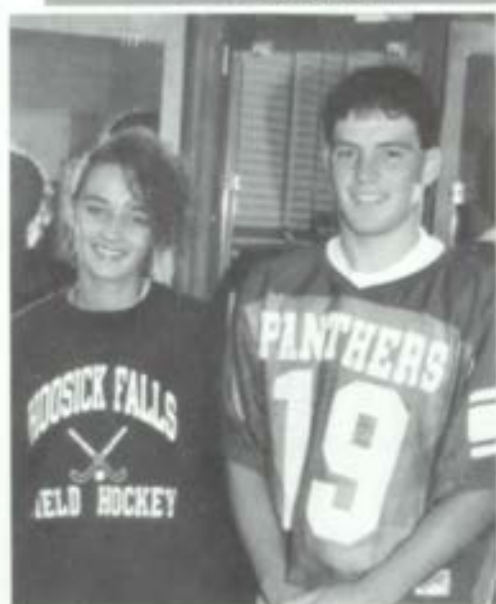
