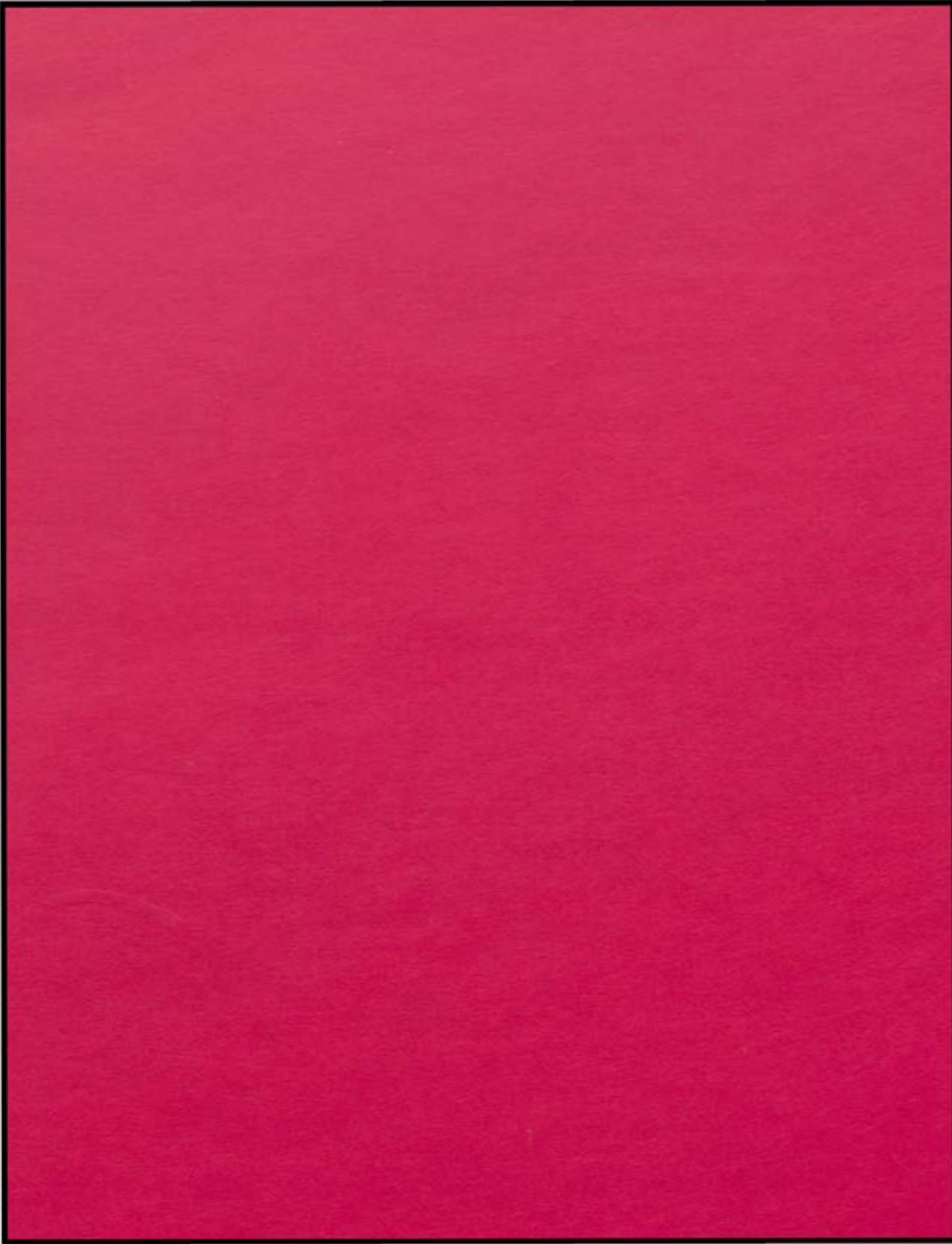

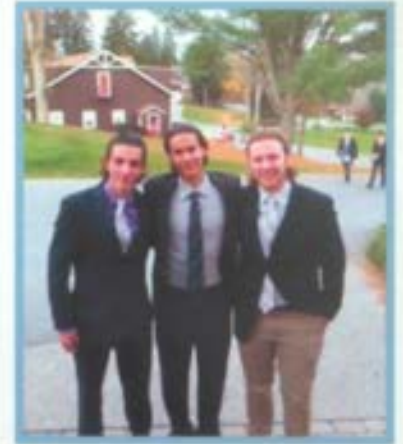


The 2014 yearbook is dedicated to our librarian, Mr. Richard Randel
