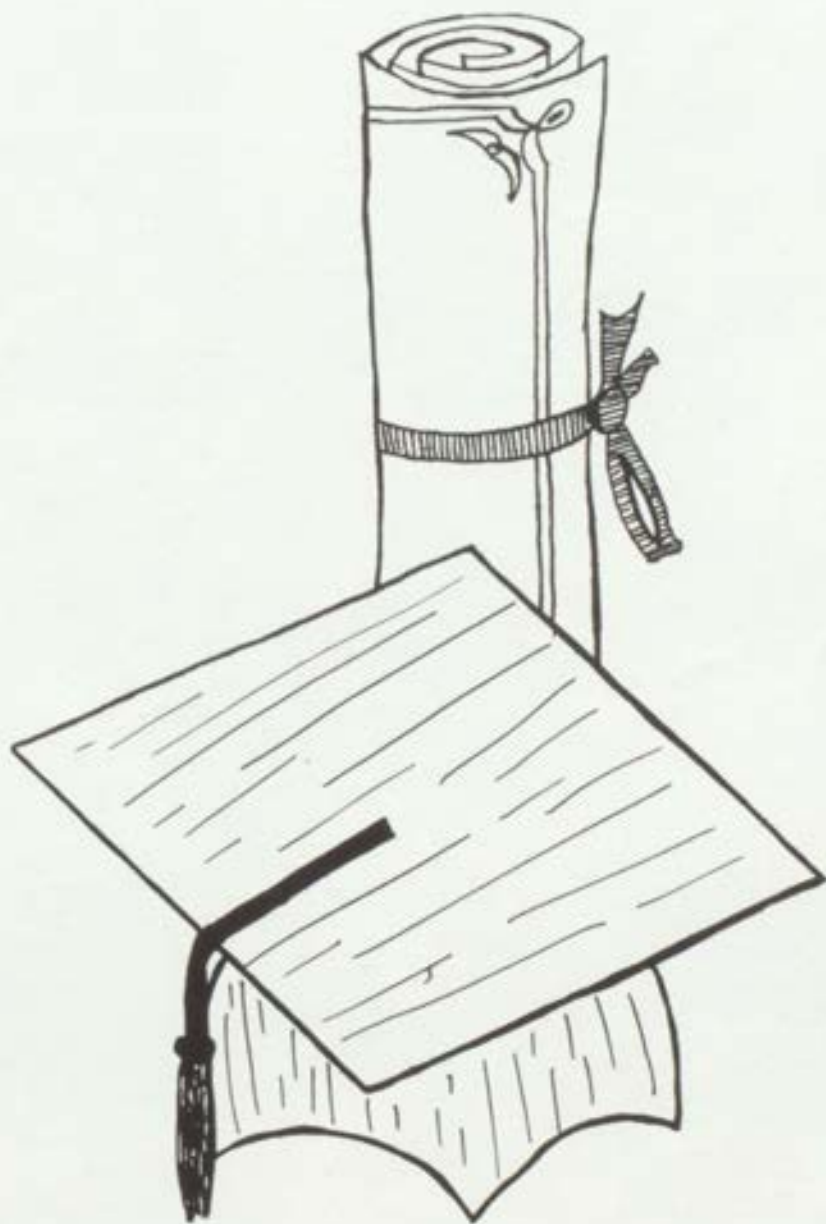
Things were pretty grim for the Mary's last year. This year the students were better than moving all memory from a poor showing last year.
