

Let this journal be a sacred space where you deepen your understanding of your identity and find inspiration to live out your faith authentically in a world that often tries to define us by other standards.


2 Corinthians 5:17 (KJV) "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."


Romans 8:1 "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."


2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."


IDENTITY





Ephesians 2:10 "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.




I can do all things through Christ!




Colossians 2:10 "And ye are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power."

I am complete in Him!

At times you might feel like you're incomplete or lacking in some areas. But that word "complete' in the Greek means "to make replete" and replete means to be filled or well supplied with something. Yes, indeed, you are well supplied with the Spirit of God! How does knowing your completeness in Christ shape your self-worth? Or how does this knowledge help you view yourself in light of your old mindset?






Colossians 3:3 "For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God."






Ephesians 5:8 "For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light."



How do you practically set your mind on things above while living in the world? Write down some strategies to keep your focus on Christ while also living in this world.








Romans 8:37 "Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us."


1 Peter 1:23 "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

You are born again by the word of God! Find other verses that go along with being born again. What does it mean for your life? How does this truth inspire you to grow and develop in your faith?








1 John 5:4 "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith."
