President's Message Barb Stewart

Here in Richmond it seems that spring has sprung, with trees and forsythias in full bloom. We are done with winter in the south. Hopefully some dormant gesneriads are feeling it too. Every time I look on my

plant stands I find something new blooming. This got me wondering if some of my plants are seasonal. I know a few are, such as *Aeschynanthus* which tend to be fall bloomers, and *Columneas*, but I really don't know about some of my others. An internet search led me to the conclusion that I just need to look up



each plant individually, as I could not find any one source for multiple gesneriads. I am thinking of starting a log to see what blooms when under my conditions. Some plants may have finally gotten the treatment they need or just reached maturity, while others only

bloom when their season comes around. This month I am highlighting some of my favorite *Sinningas*. These include *Sinningia* "Deep Purple Dreaming" (see picture in last month's Petal Tones), *Sinningia cardinalis*, *Sinningia* "Mother of Pearl", and *Sinningia bullata*.



What makes these my favorites? These are ones that never go dormant. Before they finish blooming, they

are sending up new shoots for the next round. (Notice the 2 shoots starting on Sinningia cardinalis.) I have lots of dormant Sinningia tubers, many of which will never come back to life.



Therefore, it is always exciting to see a *Sinningia* tuber start to sprout. In the meantime, I have these every-faithful varieties that regularly bloom and keep my plant shelves colorful. Hope to see you at our meeting where we shall all learn about Kohleria!

Ask Mr. Gesneriad!

Mr. Gesneriad: What do you do with the long stringy sprouts of rhizomes that have been stored too long? Can they be cut back? Barb

Mr. G:

They can be either cut back or simply wound around in the pot. If you are cutting them back, plant the rhizome just beneath the soil surface. The rhizome has already used up much of its stored energy so it should grow if not planted deeply.

If winding the stringy growth around in the pot plant just beneath the surface it will grow and be OK even if some of the stems even poke through the soil. You may find that the plant produces extra branches at these points, with the stem rooting on either side.
