Mr. Gesneriad: This is my sprouting *Sinningia conspicua* tuber. It rested for a really long time. Maybe a year. Would you recommend just putting in larger pot? I plan on that. Should I leave all the shoots and just see what happens? If it ends with with too many stems I can cut some off to prop when they grow taller. Maybe bloom for September show? Just so glad I was able to keep it from rotting. Donna Beverin

Mr. G: I would let it grow a little more but then pluck off all but three or four stems. Choose strong stems evenly spread around the tuber. One in the center for straight up growth and three others to make sure you don't see any bare stem on the others. Plenty of time for the extra shoots to root between now and September. They'll sell well if your plant is blooming in the show. Unfortunately, if it's up now it'll likely be blooming in June. Very possible for it to blooming again by September. Two years ago, Drew won Paul Susi's plant of *Sinningia* 'Party Dress' at the live auction at July's Convention. It was Paul's show plant full of bloom. Drew cut all the stems off and let them all be auctioned off too. So he went home with a naked tuber. By fall it was full of bloom again!





"*Diastema vexans* is a low-growing herbaceous plant with pretty white and lavender flowers and softly hair leaves. 
#### **BLOOMIN' NOW & HYBRIDIZING!**


So far, the *Nematanthus crassifolius* 'Bijou' blooms do not appear to have produced any seed pods on their own. So I decide to attempt to encourage the process. The first photo shows blooms that had fallen on the floor and a tiny make-up brush. The second, one of several blooms that I would use for pollen. The opened bloom in the third photo shows filled pollen sacs, the fourth, the empty pollen sacs after I brushed the pollen from them with the brush. I used several blooms worth of pollen on multiple blooms. I think this is the first time I've tried to pollinate a gesneriad. We'll see what happens. Johanna Zinn
