I lose sinningias on a regular basis because many of my dormant tubers never wake up. It is always an exciting event when one sprouts after being dormant. As for the ones who overslept, it may be time to check some of them and see if there is any life left in those tubers. I have plenty of new plants who could use the space taken up by those reluctant tubers.

November Program – Creating a Gift Terrarium

Jim Roberts We've all seen terrariums in Garden Centers and at flower shows. The beauty of a well built terrarium is that it can last just about forever with almost no care. I've got a begonia in a glass container at home that only gets opened when I need to take a cutting to share. I think it's been watered twice in ten years. It's still growing in its original soil mix!

The goal of the workshop is for each of us to create a small terrarium to give to that favorite someone who not only has a brown thumb, but has that brown infection covering his/her whole hand and half an arm. I will be bringing a selection of micro-mini Sinningia, sphagnum moss and soil mix. I will also bring a few small glass containers which you can purchase from me (at my cost) or you can bring your own; however, nothing too big or elaborate. But a glass bottle or jar with at least a half inch opening to get the tuber through would work well. Remember, it's going to be a gift, so pick something nice like maybe with a cork stopper or a clear glass tree ornament.

Everyone will go home with a container and plant. Hopefully the micro-Sinningia will be flowering by the end of December. I know you all know someone with a brown thumb (or arm). And if you don't know such a person, you get to keep the planting for yourself.

Mini Sinningia, mosses, small ferns or even cuttings of Columnea and other larger Gesneriads can be used in gift terraria too, but we're not going to be making anything that big. You can do so after the meeting; I encourage it!
