

The Metropreneur has been awarding the past ten years the Social Entrepreneurship awards, such as the Emerging Social Enterprise of the Year Award and the Social Enterprise Award, to honor and encourage those who have positively contributed through social enterprise. This year, the Deaf business, Keepsake T-Shirt Quilts/Blankets received the Social Enterprise Award in October 2022 (Evans, 2022a)!

Due to high unemployment statistics for the Deaf Community, Keepsake T-Shirt Quilts & Blankets established their non-profit business in 1998 to employ Deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals to work for them. Their website's mission statement states, "Our greatest source of pride is not the 10,000+ custom t-shirt blankets we've made over the years. It's the 115+ deaf employees that have joined us along the way." (Every Order Empowers the Deaf Community, n.d.).


