Program Overview

HEO training is a technical course that educates and trains entry level workers in the safe and efficient operation of conventional heavy equipment. The HEO training is composed of three sucessive courses that continually build on principles from previous courses through work-related instruction and performance-based training.

Level I is an introductory course that prepares workers with skills needed to become an HEO in construction and manufacturing. The Level I training includes :

- Intro to HEO trades
- Heavy Equipment Safety
- Identifying Heavy Equipment
- Basic Operational Techniques
- Operating General Utility Trailers
- Intro to Earth Moving
- Preparing Grade Surfaces
- Operating Conventional Forklifts.
