# Preparing for El Salvador!



Hello, Friends! Hola, Amigos!

We are the Vega family! We would like to share a little bit of our story, history, and calling as missionaries.

Uzi, from El Salvador, and Bethany, from the U.S., met in 2013 while serving and training with Youth With A Mission in Costa Rica. We were married in 2015, got custody of Uzi's daughter, Genesis, and continued to serve as full time missionaries until 2018 when our first son, Isaac was born. We came to the United States for a sabbatical with the purpose of getting Uzi's U.S. citizenship and establishing a connection with our church family before returning to the field. Then, just like the rest of the world, our plans were affected by the sudden appearance of the covid-19 virus. In the waiting, our son Tobías was born in May 2022.

Now, after five and half years of living in the United States Uzi has his citizenship, and we are FINALLY preparing to return to where our hearts belong: the mission field! This coming January, we will be serving Youth With A Mission again, this time in El Salvador as full time staff. We are so excited to pour the gifts and talents God has blessed us with into Uzi's beautiful homeland; to see the resurrection of a lost hope, restoration of the family unit, and to see communities develop into healthy and thriving places! El Salvador (in English, The Savior) has been ravaged by corrupt government and gang violence for decades, but the political atmosphere is shifting. Corrupt politicians are being weeded out and gang members are being imprisoned by the thousands. There is a growing sense of freedom and hope, but the wounds and scars and pain are still there, in need of the healing touch of the Father.

**Why El Salvador?** In our time in the States, we did a lot of praying and seeking and asking questions about things that God had put in our hearts over the years. What we saw was a pile of puzzle pieces and no idea of where to start. But God spoke confirmation from three people who didn't know each other and were in different countries! God said, "I gave you all the pieces, just start and I will guide you!" So what are those pieces that fit in El Salvador? **Connections, Empowerment**, and **Immersion**.

**Connections:** The need for mental health workers is enormous and we have already started conversations with mental health care workers here about bringing their training to El Salvador to equip YWAMers and local pastors to be able to minister in this area. We also have a huge desire to see more U.S. church members experience missions in order to be a blessing and to grow in their walk with the Lord. Lastly, we are working to connect/coordinate the pioneering of a new training course for YWAM that focuses on worship, intercessory prayer, spiritual warfare, and evangelism, in order to be more effective in ministry.

**Empowerment:** We want to see the Salvadorans take ownership in the growth and restoration of their country. We believe that God has connected us to key people and ministries for the task of equipping the people so that they can rise up and take hold of the blessings God has for them.

**Immersion:** Before we were married, we talked and prayed about how we wanted to raise our kids and what things were important to us as individuals, but also as a missionary family. Our desire is to live with a diverse "Kingdom culture", where the best parts of our cultures are drawn out to honor God. We want to have our kids immersed in Salvadoran culture so that part of their heritage is not lost.

Who/what is Youth With A Mission? Youth with a Mission (YWAM) is an international and interdenominational Christian training organization founded in 1960. The three focuses are in training, mercy ministries, and evangelism with the goal of seeing God in each of the 7 spheres of society (family, economics, government, religion, education, media, and the arts). There are more than 1,200 working locations in over 180 countries. Each year approximately 25,000 short term missionaries are sent around the globe.

What will we be doing? As full time staff, we will have general operations responsibilities (i.e. property maintenance, kitchen duties, hospitality, etc.), work utilizing our gifts and talents (i.e. Spanish/English translation, administration, discipling/mentoring, etc.), and being involved with ministries of the base (i.e. mercy ministries, kids programs, Bible and literacy classes, etc.). So what might our day look like? In the morning, we may be preparing breakfast for a team that has come to build a home for a single mother in the community. After breakfast, Uzi could be translating for classes while Bethany homeschools and works in communications. After lunch, we prepare for kids ministry (a hot meal and a fun Bible study out in the community) or helping to build the house with the team. On the way back from ministry, we might stop to do the grocery shopping for the base meals for the rest of the week. More translating for Uzi for evening classes! Before dinner, someone needs to talk and process; Bethany can help with that! Dinner might be done, but the day is not finished; time to sort through the vegetable donations that have just been dropped off. Now we can rest for another busy day!





### My People Perish For Lack Of Knowledge

In 2018, I took a leap of faith and ventured into the financial services field. I focused on life insurance where I discovered how much false information exists and how many people are being misled about financial matters. This drove me to become an expert on the subject. # Platonic or Intimate YOU Decide!

A platonic relationship is confined to words, theories or ideals that do not lead to practical actions. Platonic relationship are usually just friends or an acquaintance. A person one knows slightly like a co-worker or colleague.

An intimate relationship is one that is detailed and thorough, private and personal, someone who participates in another's life with love and concern. A close, valued and cherished relationship.

Hebrews 11:6, An intimate relationship with GOD comes with responsibilities and duties that must be performed to please him, show your trust and faith in him, and demonstrate a high level of confidence in his ability to fulfill his Word.

God wants his house filled with those who love him. 



Prayer: "Father, thank you I can rest in the fact that because you rose again, I can climb the spider spout, again!" In Jesu's Name Amen



### **AN INTIMATE RELTIONSHIP WITH GOD**

In a natural sense, a platonic relationship is only intimate to a point. A causal relationship is more of a relaxed relationship and not applied on a regular basis. A mental relationship is one only within your mind, but a spiritual relationship describes the intimacy shared by two by people, each knowing and caring for one another more personally in every way exceeding all other relationships within an acquaintance. Of course, all of us desire to have a relationship where we always feel received, respected, and valued. So does God!

As in any relationship, spiritual intimacy requires a specific place and time set aside to commune with God on a daily basis. As children of God, we need to hear from God and He wants and needs to hear from us. And we can do so by listening to His direction in prayer and reading His word. One cannot go without the other otherwise we are spiritually unbalanced. Also, we must be truthful within ourselves concerning EVERY relationship we have with others and with God because a relationship can only be as relevant based on the TRUTH within it. How we treat one another usually determines the quality of a relationship. This is true of a natural or a spiritual relationship. Someone said if you only drank water once a week what would happen to your health? Likewise, if we only spoke or communicated with our spouse, or friends how could the relationship survive? So, the same holds true with our relationship with The Lord! The Bible says in James 4:8a says draw close to God & He will draw close to you. Verse 10 speaks of humility. When knowledge alone replaces our intimate knowledge and relationship with God it increases pride in self or self-pride.

The posture of prayer is of one who shows his/her respect by bowing the head or to lay down prostrate before God in an act of humility. This is one way of honoring God without allowing our flesh to take control of our mind, will or emotions which if undisciplined will cause us to neglect our lifeline to God. In other words, our choices we make that would get us closer to God are predicated on how much we surrender our will to God daily. "Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof."


Proverbs 18:21



1 Corinthians (1 Co) 13:1-13 CJB

[1] I may speak in the tongues of men, even angels; but if I lack love, I have become merely blaring brass or a cymbal clanging. [2] I may have the gift of prophecy, I may fathom all mysteries, know all things, have all faith — enough to move mountains; but if I lack love, I am nothing. [3] I may give away everything that I own, I may even hand over my body to be burned; but if I lack love, I gain nothing. [4] Love is patient and kind, not jealous, not boastful, [5] not proud, rude or selfish, not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. [6] Love does not gloat over other people's sins but takes its delight in the truth. [7] Love always bears up, always trusts, always hopes, always endures. [8] Love never ends; but prophecies will pass, tongues will cease, knowledge will pass. [9] For our knowledge is partial, and our prophecy partial; [10] but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass. [11] When I was a child, I spoke like a child, thought like a child, argued like a child; now that I have become a man, I have finished with childish ways. [12] For now we see obscurely in a mirror, but then it will be face to face. Now I know partly; then I will know fully, just as God has fully known me. [13] But for now, three things last trust, hope, love; and the greatest of these is love.

This is what the mirror corrects in every aspect of our lives. What reflection are we casting back when we examine ourselves? Is everything lined up as it should be? You judge yourself against the Word of God and see what this mirror provides. Because when our slip is showing at the final reveal the Words we will hear are "Depart from me for I know you not ye worker of iniquity..." Yes, it just got real.
