Action 21-217: Motion by Schneider, 2nd by Moes, to approve the consent agenda with approval of the minutes from January 13, 2021, regular meeting, treasurer's report from January 2020, unadjusted financial statements, status of expense, status of revenue, revenue and expense reports, adjusted journal entries for January 2021, approval of library report, and approval of bus report. All ayes.

Mr. Wieseler gave the board an updated the curriculum review for k-12 math and k-8 english/grammar to supplement our core Reading series. Darwin K from Camrose spoke to Mr. Wieseler about the Camrose Elementary School Library. Darwin K wanted to know if the board would consider matching funds for the new library book that are colony-approved. Parent/Teacher Conference will be held on March 4th. The current plan is 7-12 by appointment/request only and virtual and Pre-school to 6 grade will be scheduled and virtual. Please start to think about the spring concert.

Mr. Hulscher gave information on curriculum of mid terms for the 3rd quarter will be mailed out today. The school will offer driver's education with the same guidelines as in the past years. Mr. Hulscher handed out an updated version of the 2021-2022. Mr. Hulscher gave the information the DEA(Doland Education Association) would like to see on the 2021-2022 calendar. Mr. Hulscher asked where to place the banner from the Inauguration Parade? The food service inspection was a 98 for the Doland School. Mr. Hulscher reviewed the staff and students information in regards to COVID 19 as of today. Next year will be the grade 3-6 to the SD State Fair. Senior banner will be placed somewhere in the school. A new Chiefs banner for the gym. The Doland School has on virtual learner. ACCESS testing has started today with Mr. Hulscher and Mrs. Rasmussen. State testing window opens in early March and goes into early May. Mr. Hulscher has located some of the old pane glass doors. Graduation will be a 2:27 p.m. Mr. Hulscher gave a new projected enrollment sheet.

The current enrollment for Clark Colony is 13, Camrose Colony is 10, Hillside Colony Elementary is 20, Hillside Colony High School is 2, Doland Attendance Cent is 89 for a total of 134 without pre school. Projected enrollment for the 2021-2022 is the be 142, and 2022-2023 is projected to be 139.

Petitions are due to the school business office by 5:00 p.m. on February 26, 2021, Friday, in the business office. Certified mail by February 26, 2021, by 5:00 p.m.
