In 1883, the Women's Auxiliary — which provided an organized way for women who were excluded from membership on official church boards to serve the church — took up a small collection that funded much of the missionary outreach of The Episcopal Church of that time, as documented by "A Brief History of the United Thank Offering."

Presiding Bishop Nominees

The episcopal church selects one bishop to serve as Presiding Bishop (PB) for a nine-year term.

The five candidates who will stand for election to become the 28th presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church, are Bishop J. Scott Barker of the Diocese of Nebraska, Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe of the Diocese of Central New York, Bishop Daniel G. P. Gutiérrez of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, Bishop Sean Rowe of the Diocese of Northwestern Pennsylvania and Diocese of Western New York and Bishop Robert Wright of the Diocese of Atlanta.

The vote to select the next presiding bishop will be held in June to succeed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, whose nine-year term concludes on Oct. 31.

The election is scheduled for June 26 at the General Convention, which will take place in Louisville, Kentucky, this year. The House of Bishops will elect the next presiding bishop in a sequestered session, and the House of Deputies, a second voting body of the General Convention made of clergy and lay deputies, will confirm, or refuse the bishops' election.

Bishop Curry, 71, has been among the better-known presiding bishops in recent decades, not only because of the history made by his election as a Black man, but because he was invited to give the sermon at the wedding of the Duke and Duchess of Sussex in 2018. Since May 2023, Curry has been receiving medical treatment for internal bleeding and heart conditions. In March 2024, he received a pacemaker to treat his atrial fibrillation.
