Dear Falkner Swamp Beloved,

Canadian Pastor Jim Taylor reminds us of one of Jesus' familiar parables, the sower of the seeds,* and how it uniquely relates to Christmas:

"He scattered seed on rocks, among thorns, on a pathway ... Only a small portion fell on good ground and returned a crop. By any conventional standards, that farmer would be a failure.

But it's a perfect reflection of the way God – embodied in nature – scatters seeds. Wildly. Extravagantly. Profligately.

In nature, it seems to me, God never plants just one seed and expects it to mature. Except at Christmas."

Taylor points out that in Jesus, God planted this one seed. And as Mary lay, exhausted from traveling and giving birth in a stinky, filthy stable, she clutched a bit of heaven that had come to earth.

In this one seed, this "branch from the stump of Jesse," a quote from the prophet Isaiah that gospel writers insert to place Jesus in the family tree of King David, from this branch falls many seeds in its season, year after year.

As Jesus lived and taught, then died, and rose to God, so too his followers live on sharing his life, sowing many seeds flung across all types of soil. From the <u>one</u> Messiah, then, are planted many little messiahs. For Messiah means "anointed one," or "deliverer," even "leader for a particular cause."

Pastor Taylor's observations lead us to wonder, as little messiahs ourselves, what will we help deliver? What cause or purpose will call to us, as the seedling in us grows to maturity?

What is being planted in you this Advent? How can you, like Mary, take a bit of heaven fallen to earth and nurture the growth of God's planting in you?

Update from the budget committee:

Our expenses continue to be larger than our income. We have been drawing down our accounts all year long. The budget team is working on a plan to boost income and decrease expenses. We ask the congregation for their support in these efforts. Please consider increasing your weekly tithings. If we all chip in just a little bit more each month, it will help us to achieve our goal of offsetting the costs to operate our church.

We welcome ideas from the congregation on ways to bring more people in to our faith community.



Electronic Giving!

Did you know Falkner Swamp offers an electronic option for making regular offerings? Contributions can be made using your bank account, debit or credit card. This offers convenience for you and much-needed donation consistency for our congregation. Collection basket offerings can

fluctuate significantly from week to week due to travel, illness and other circumstances, but when contributions are automated, the church receives funds on a steady, uninterrupted basis.
