This month on Pentecost our church confirms Lucas Krause, affirming his baptism and joyfully receiving him as a member of the church.

A team of three led Lucas in his course this year: Becky Comer, Susan Mercer, and me. A team of two, rotating each session, met with Lucas twice monthly from September to May. We covered the typical subjects for a Confirmation class: the Bible, the Trinity, the church's foundation, purpose, and the UCC, the sacraments and spiritual disciplines.

Susan's teaching experience led to creative materials, games and visuals, including a scrabble-like bulletin board to help Lucas learn "church-y" words, like salvation. Take a peek inside the room downstairs – you can refresh your vocabulary!

We visited two other places of worship, St Theresa of Calcutta in Limerick and the synagogue in Pottstown, Congregation Hesed Shel Emet (Mercy & Truth). We were welcomed in each location and offered a brief tour with an opportunity to ask questions.

Lucas participated in service, both in our church and beyond. He helped serve a meal with our members at First Presbyterian in Pottstown and at some of our Community Breakfasts and rode along with the Comers to deliver Meals on Wheels. You have also been greeted by him as you came to worship on several Sundays, and he assisted as lay leader or with the children's messages.

Rounding out his introduction to membership in a faith community, Lucas also attended various meetings for that "behind the scenes" education. He and his dad attended our denominational Pennsylvania Southeast Conference Fall meeting in November. Lucas joined Rob also for a Consistory meeting and his mom for a Music & Worship meeting.

Many participated in Lucas' capstone project on April 21, "Lucas' Italian Delight," a selection of scrumptious lasagnas for lunch after worship or to take away. Lucas announced in church on April 28 that \$800 was raised through our participation, all given to the family of a classmate who has a rare brain tumor, for his care.

I know we all look forward to May 19, when Lucas becomes, like our other Confirmands, not only the "youth of our church" but our brother in Christ, a fellow traveler on the Way.




Ladies Night was a huge success! Great food, fellowship and entertainment. Thank you to everyone involved who helped make the evening so special.

Our Stewardship Seeds: Stewardship is Heart Work

A new committee has been formed. We call ourselves the Stewardship Team. Our goal is to create in our church family a true and clear understanding of what stewardship means, what it feels like, and how to infuse it into our daily Christian living. We will be transparent as we keep you informed about the structures and finances of our church.

The goal of pure stewardship is simply not "more giving". But rather, it is the development of a **spirit of gratitude and generosity**. Out of our love and gratitude for everything God gives us, the love and joy in generosity springs forward. As our United Church of Christ Statement of Faith explains, "He (Christ) calls us into His Church to accept the cost and **joy** of discipleship(stewardship)."

We are all disciples of Christ Jesus. As **Christ**ians, we shape our living in the way Jesus Christ lived-loving and caring for ourselves and others. Living and loving and caring from the heart. Stewardship, just like discipleship, is indeed HEART work.

As a Stewardship Team, we understand and accept the "rightness" of the following statement: Stewardship, like discipleship, is a lifelong journey. We are all in different stages, moving at a different pace.

No matter where we are on our life journey, as Christian Stewards, we need to consider the essential elements of stewardship, **Time**, **Talents**, **Treasures**, **and Truth/Transparency**, and how we can invest ourselves in them. What will our <u>current</u> life situation allow? Which element(s)? How much? When? Where? How long? We know the combination of our choices will change as our life's dynamics change and evolve.

What does <u>not</u> change is our gratitude to God for all the blessings He has given us. What does <u>not</u> change is that what we lovingly give back to God comes from the heart. Our choices reflect an awe-inspiring spirit of gratitude and generosity, pure and simple.

If you would like to be part of the Stewardship Team, we have a place saved just for you. Come join us- Karen Miller, Lee Comer, Susan Mercer, and Rev. Frances (ex-officio) **Essential Elements of Stewardship: Treasures/Transparency/Truth** What do we do with the **treasures (collection monies)** we give to the church? On each envelope, 3 broad areas are designated- **Current**, **Benevolence**, and **Special/Other**. Each person decides where and how much of their gift goes into those areas. To help us understand more clearly what is covered in each category, please look at the lists below. As you see, the **Current** list encompasses a large part of our day-to-day running expenses, which became the energy behind our consideration for increasing our gifts by 10%. If the gift is \$5 now, can it be raised to \$5.50? We will be tracking this endeavor and letting you know its impact.
