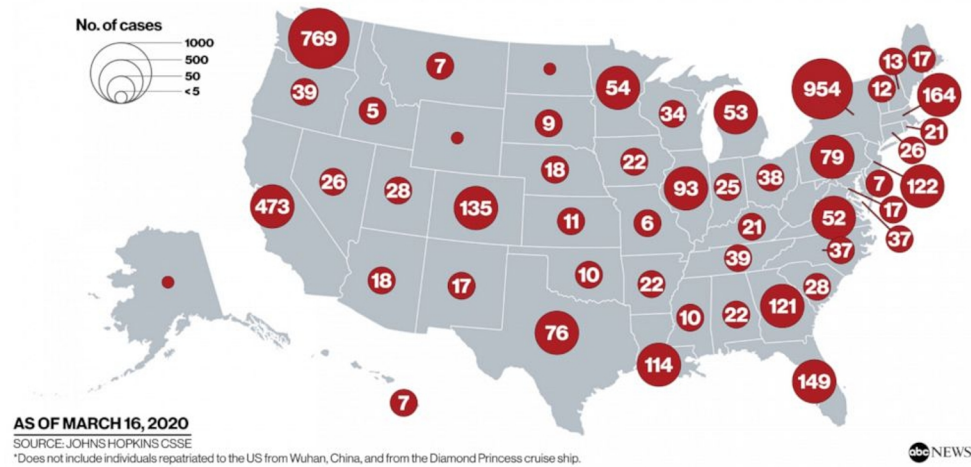

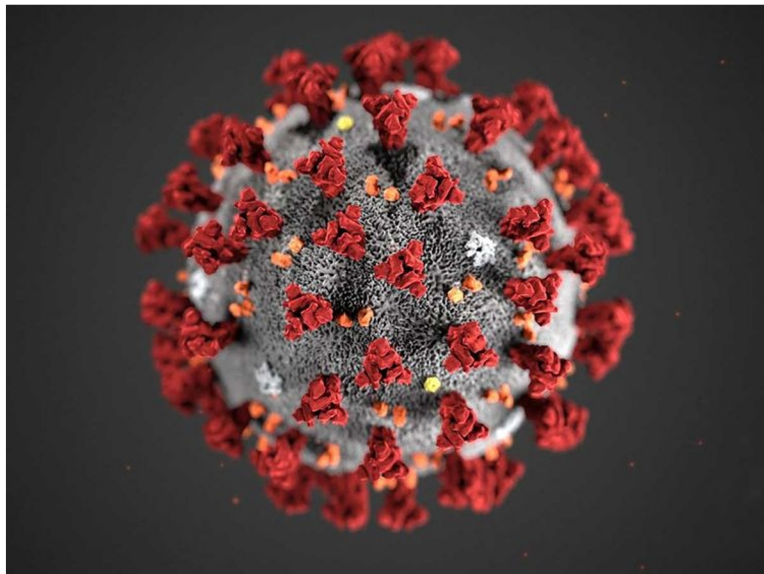

To the Cranbury Community:

In light of the ongoing Covid19 pandemic, the emergency management team of Police Chief Rickey Varga, Township Administrator Denise Marabello and myself met this morning. As of this morning, there are no known Covid19 cases in Cranbury, however, there are measures in place to maintain the continuity of operations should it become necessary.

As you know if you have children at Princeton High School, they will utilize remote learning for at least two weeks starting next Monday. The Cranbury School is closed today as the staff plans for their next steps.

We are encouraging the community to adhere to the best practices outlined by the state Department of Health (https://www.nj.gov/health/cd/topics/covid2019_community.shtml), including social distancing, hand washing, and staying home if you feel sick.

Community Spread

Numerous departmental events in March and the April 1, 2020 General Meeting (an Evening Tea to be hosted by the Gourmet Department) were cancelled because of the Covid-19 Pandemic.



Princeton High School senior, Jordan Guidi, won our **High School scholarship** for \$2,000. She has participated in the Cranbury EMS squad, volunteered at clinics for younger children, helped at her church and with different events at the Cranbury school. She will be attending the University of Tampa in the fall and hopes to continue her education in Medical School.

Our annual **Community Service Award** went to two Eighth Grade Students from Cranbury School. Teachers and counselors select the recipients based on the student's service to both the School and the Community. The two students will receive checks for \$100.00 each. They also have their names engraved on a commemorative plaque which is displayed in the School.

At school, the first student winner helped organize the diaper and Valentine's Day drives, is a peer leader, a wingman leader supporting younger students, and baked for the Variety Show. The recipient volunteers at the AFEW animal shelter and the Princeton Pantry.

The second recipient participated in all Student Council drives and fundraisers, is a wingman leader, and a student ambassador for HelpMeSee an around the world organization which raises money for people with cataract blindness. Most recently, with COVID19 in mind, the student set up a team for Cranbury at Folding@home which is a computing project aimed to help scientists develop new therapeutics to a variety of diseases by the means of simulating protein dynamics.
