A Call to the Annual Meeting of University Presbyterian Church Sunday, February 7, 2021 at 12 noon

UPC will hold its Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 7 at 12 noon. At this meeting we receive the committee reports from the past year, review and answer questions regarding the budget for the new year, and conduct two necessary votes as delineated in the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Book of Order:

The election of church officers

The approval of the Pastor's compensation for the new year

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the means for conducting this Annual meeting have been altered. These changes are as follows:

1. The Annual Report will be emailed to you.

Please read it carefully and note any questions or concerns you have for later discussion. A hard copy of the Report will also be available at the Church Office.

2. The Annual Meeting will be conducted via Zoom on Sunday, February 7 at 12 noon.

At this meeting we will answer any questions and receive members' comments regarding any part of the annual report and/or nominations of officers and the Pastor's compensation. A link for this meeting will be emailed to you.

3. The Election of Officers and the Approval of the Pastor's Compensation will be conducted by mail-in ballot.

A ballot will be mailed to those who are official members of UPC.

Everyone is welcome to attend the Annual Meeting but we ask that only those who have officially become members of UPC cast a ballot.

The deadline for receiving the ballots is **Friday**, **February 12th**. The results will be emailed to the congregation.

Ash Wednesday Service Wednesday, February 17 Live-streamed at 7 p.m. "A Service of Grief and a Cry for Help"

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday.

Ashes on the forehead is a sign of our humanity and a reminder of our mortality. Lent is not a matter of being good, and wearing ashes is not about showing off one's faith. The ashes are a reminder to us and our communities of our finite creatureliness. The ashes we wear on our Lenten journey symbolize the dust and broken debris of our lives as well as the reality that eventually each of us will die. And so we turn to God in grief and in need.

This year's Ash Wednesday service will be an occasion to grieve the more than 400,000 Americans who have died and to call upon God's help in confronting the various kinds of deaths we endure.

Worshippers are welcome to gather their own ashes/dirt for the service: from a fireplace, or by safely burning some paper in advance, or by gathering some soil from a potted plant or from outside your home.

The service will be live-streamed on our Facebook page at 7 p.m. or you can watch the recording at a later time.

Lenten Adult Bible Study

During the season of Lent, the mid-week Adult Bible Study will explore the concepts of "Sin and Salvation."

How can we modern people understand these two "old-fashioned" words? What do these concepts mean to us?

This four week series begins on Wednesday, February 17 at 1 p.m. The link is emailed to the congregations each week. Hope to see you there!

The Blessings Behind Per Capita Giving

The Presbyterian Church (USA) is part of what is called "a connectional system." What that means is that our congregations are not isolated units but, rather, they are connected to one another. Just as the denomination supports individual congregations in a variety of ways, the congregations also support the larger ministries of the national Church: mission projects, disaster relief, worship materials and resources, personnel support, etc. We believe this "connectional system" reflects our theological beliefs that we are all part of the larger Body of Christ.

To support this larger system of relationships and ministries, each church is asked to pay \$30/member to the larger denomination. That contribution is called our "per capita" giving.

This year, UPC will send the denomination \$4,464 in per capita giving. We ask our congregational members to help off-set that contribution by making a gift of just \$30 per person to cover the per capita expenses. If you are able to make an additional gift of \$30, please earmark your envelope or check with the words, "Per Capita Contribution" or use the Per Capita envelope found in your box of pledge envelopes. And thank you!

Alternative Christmas Giving Results

During the Christmas season, UPC conducted its annual Alternative Giving fund drive. This year's recipient was RIP Medical Debt, an organization which uses donations to cancel the crushing burden of medical debts born by millions of Americans. Through your contributions, UPC raised \$2,070—which cancels \$200,070 worth of medical debt!! Well done everyone!
