Message from our Pastor

Buffalo is a border town. Canada lies barely ten minutes from us—maybe less, depending on where you live. And yet, through the ministries of two UPC church members, our congregation has been attentive for many years to concerns on the other U.S. border—the one with Mexico. Howard Henry and Lee Ann Grace have spent years volunteering with the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s border ministry with migrant peoples, called Frontera de Cristo. Each year Howard and Lee Ann make a pilgrimage to the southern border in Arizona, where for a number of weeks they help in numerous ways: teaching English, preparing sandwiches, serving meals, and assisting with office work. And then they come back to WNY and engage the rest of us in caring and responding. That's called *evangelism*—sharing the good news of God's love and then inviting others to join in!

And we have joined in through many ways: through our support of Just Coffee, through our prayers, by inviting guests from Frontera de Cristo to speak in our congregation, through our donations.

This April, UPC continues to attend to the humanitarian ministries extended by Frontera de Cristo. As the final event in our congregation's centennial celebration, UPC is offering the second Concert for a Cause to benefit Frontera de Cristo. This event will be a jazz concert held here at UPC on Sunday, April 24 at 3 p.m. Earlier that same day, Howard and Lee Ann will lead worship and share how they have witnessed through the efforts the Frontera de Cristo the life-sustaining spirit of God bringing hope, help, and new life to the human struggles on the U.S./Mexican border.

I hope you will join us on April 24.

JAZZ IT UP!

The Buffalo State Jazz Chamber Ensemble, under the direction of Dr. Mark Filsinger, will be featured in the second UPC centennial Concert for a Cause **on**

Sunday, April 24 at 3:00 p.m.

The ensemble consists of five instrumentalists (trumpet, saxophone, guitar, bass, and drums), who will be joined by a vocalist for several numbers.

Proceeds of the concert will benefit Frontera de Cristo, the Presbyterian Border Outreach Program at Douglas, Arizona and Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico, where Lee Ann Grace and Howard Henry have volunteered for 30+ years. U.S. Coordinator Mark Adams tells us that Frontera will use the funds raised to support unbudgeted repairs at the Migrant Resource Center (MRC), which served 6000+ people during the five weeks Lee Ann and Howard spent there in January and February.

During Howard and Lee Ann's service at the MRC this year, several days of 30 mph winds shredded the canvas sides of the dining shelter, which is the only area where migrants can seek refuge from the cold and wind. Replacement cost totals \$753. In addition, the MRC must add an emergency exit on the second floor in order to meet new Mexican code requirements. The cost will be \$4590.

Mark your calendars! Come enjoy superb music and help Frontera de Cristo minister to our vulnerable brothers and sisters served by the Migrant Resource Center.
