<u>Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada News</u>

In response to the situation in Ukraine, IRCC is taking steps to support Ukrainians and make it easier and faster for Canadian citizens, Canadian permanent residents and their immediate family members to return to Canada.

They have set up a dedicated Ukraine enquiries phone line for clients in Canada and abroad: 613-321-4243, collect calls accepted. Clients contacting IRCC by use of their Web Form should add the keyword "Ukraine2022" in their enquiry and their email will be prioritized.

FUN Fact about Canada!







The first inhabitants of Canada were the Indigenous people. Indigenous Peoples are composed of three major groups: First Nations, Metis and Inuit. The Canadian government recognizes 634 different First Nations across Canada. Each of these First Nations is a community which exists on a reserve (land set aside by our federal government for the use and occupancy of a First Nation group). There are more than 60 Indigenous languages spoken in these communities.

Indigenous cultures have a rich oral tradition. Teachings (values, spiritual and traditional beliefs) were passed down from generation to generation by way of storytelling, song, dance and other oral means. According to the Canadian Encyclopedia, there are 70 distinct Indigenous languages in Canada that fall into 12 separate language families.

The world is watching as Ukraine defends itself against Russia in a war that has already left cities in rubble, hundreds dead, hundreds of thousands displaced and families torn apart. Saskatchewan has strong, deep ties with Ukraine. Roughly 13 per cent of Saskatchewan's population claims Ukrainian heritage. People here are watching in horror as this war unfolds. This Thursday, March 3rd, Rawlco Radio is holding a Saskatchewan Day of Caring for Ukraine, in partnership with Ukrainian Canadian Congress(UCC) & Canadian-Ukraine Foundation(CUF). "As we watch the news each day, we can't help but feel their fears in our own hearts," reads a statement issued by UCC acting president Elena Krueger and Executive Director Danylo Puderak. "These attacks on innocent Ukrainians are an attack on us. Today, we ask all Saskatchewanians, our friends, neighbours. colleagues, and all freedom-loving people to show we care through the Rawlco Radio Saskatchewan Day of Caring for Ukraine. Please support the Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal. "The appeal's main efforts will be to provide humanitarian assistance/relief in the areas of assistance to displaced persons, medical care, emergency shelter and food security." From 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., 650 CKOM will bring you the stories of those living in Ukraine, those fighting to get them help and what your donation will provide. The UCC-CUF Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal has already deployed approximately \$500,000 CAD to provide food packages, medicine and shelter. The Rawlco Radio Saskatchewan Day of Caring

for Ukraine provides you the chance to help this campaign.
Yorkton will also have local locations available for humanitarian collections.
