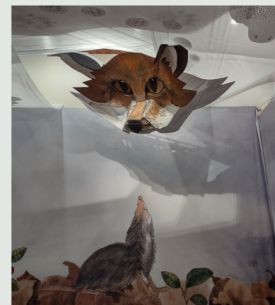

In process since Dec 2023, Victoria Zalatoris did all the illustrations for the animals and the backgrounds. About 25 illustrations total in pen and ink and watercolor. The artwork was done on a 1" to 1' scale, so a 4- inch mouse was blown up to a 4- foot mouse. The purpose of the show is to illustrate life in the Subnivean Zone which is the layer beneath the snow, on top of the earth and dead plant life. Victoria has worked on several projects at the museum over the past 10 years and often illustrates animals in various styles of art depending on the purpose.

This is an amazing show for young and old created by naturalist Emily Stone and put together by museum volunteers.

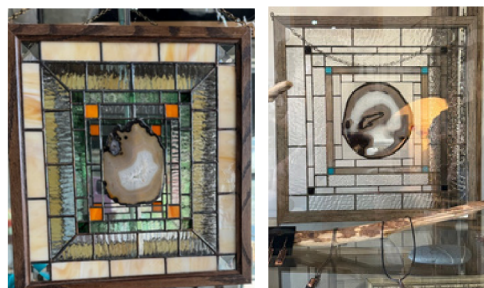

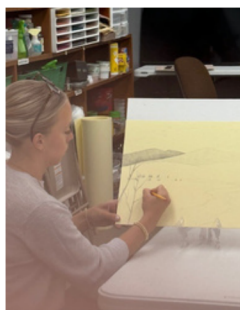
