### **Anniversary Reminiscences**

#### **Grace Denis**

Grace is the daughter of Rowena Harrison, granddaughter of Reece and Grace Gilbert and niece of Rebecca Craig. All these people were past members of the church, and the Gilberts were an important part of the foundation of Webster Church.

Grace Denis was baptized at Webster Church on Christmas Eve, 1944. Her grandfather Reece Gilbert would come every Sunday morning, early to turn on the furnace for Sunday service. He would then return home to milk the cows and return to the service and count the plate and serve as treasurer.

### Did you Know:

### Did you know how Webster Church began?

May 22, 1923 - Original church, Webster Community Church (Methodist Protestant) was completed. (The church was on land on the opposite side of Webster Rd) January 4, 1924 – Fire completely destroyed the original church.

January 31. 1924 – A meeting was held to elect a committee to procure ground, make plans and start the task of building.

February 10, 1924 – Ground was broken by John Macklem on land donated by Mr. & Mrs. T.D. Miller and Mr. & Mrs. Robert Tollenger

February 29, 1924 – The congregation decided to withdraw from the Maryland Conference of Methodist Protestant Churches.

March 27, 1924 – Joined the Christian Conference

During rebuilding the congregation met at Wesleyan Chapel Methodist Church.

August 23, 1924 – The cornerstone was laid, the first dinner was served, and the bell was rung for the first time.

August 24, 1924 – The official service of dedication was held.

### Blessings in a Backpack - Support a Child

Each Friday 75 students at Havre de Grace Elementary School receive backpacks of nonperishable food for the weekend. For some of the children this may be the only food they have for the weekend. This program is possible through Blessings in a Backpack, one of the outreach programs at Webster Congregational Christian Church.

We are continuing to raise funds for this very important program because students who are well nourished function better academically and socially. \$125 will supply food for a year per child. Around 200 students are eligible for the backpacks, but our funds don't allow us to feed that many students. A special thank you to those you contribute to ths outreach program.
